

Issues with Halal Supply Chains


Halal supply chains are **vulnerable** and **complex** to manage

- Halal is not a consolidation requirement in stuffing of mixed trucks, containers, and ULDs
- Different knowledge levels and segregation practices in halal supply chains
- The halal status of cargo is not communicated on freight documents, cargo labels, and in ICT systems
- Different requirements for different Muslim markets


Issues with Halal Supply Chains

Serious GAPs in halal supply chains, resulting in a deficient halal assurance system!


1. Halal Supply Chain Management System standard for logistics and retailing

2. 3 modules:


- i. Management system requirements for transportation of goods and/or cargo chain services
- ii. Management system requirements for warehousing and related activities
- iii. Management system requirements for retailing
- 3. Developed by: **Department of Standard Malaysia** (launched in 2010; first revision in 2019)
- 4. Certified by: **Jakim** (since 2015)


