Areas Involved	SARAWAK, KELANTAN, PENANG, SELANGOR, F.T. KUALA LUMPUR, JOHOR, NEGERI SEMBILAN (SEREMBAN DISTRICT) AND KEDAH (KUALA MUDA DISTRICT). *For Sabah, please refer to the State of Sabah CMCO SOP *For Sarawak, please refer to the State of Sarawak CMCO SOP
Effective Period	29 April 2021 (from 12:01 am) until 17 May 2021 (11:59 pm) For Sarawak, it begins from 27 April 2021 (from 12:01 am) until 17 May 2021 (11:59 pm)
Movement Control	 Movement within CMCO areas is ALLOWED. F.T. Kuala Lumpur and Selangor are considered as one zone and cross-border movement is allowed. Movement to other CMCO areas, Movement Control Order (MCO), Recovery Movement Control Order (RMCO) and Enhanced Movement Control Order (EMCO) areas are NOT ALLOWED except with PERMISSION from the RMP. The number of passengers in private vehicles is in accordance with the vehicle's capacity. However, high risk individuals and children are not encouraged to go out to public, open and congested areas. The number of people permitted in vehicles transporting essential goods and services and the economic / industrial supply chain is dependent on the commercial vehicle registration license. The movement of private, Government department or private company vehicles for the purpose of traveling to and from work or to conduct official government business is dependent on the seating capacity of the vehicle. Activities and services at all airports and ports are ALLOWED to operate. Public transportation services such as bus stops, express buses, LRT/MRT/ERL/monorail, ferries, airplanes, taxi / e-hailing services and other public transportation are ALLOWED to operate (operational hours in accordance with license terms) based on the capacity of the vehicle. Food delivery services are ALLOWED to operate from 6:00 am to 12.00 midnight for the duration of the CMCO. Permission for inter-state movement is allowed for long-distance married couples with the permission of PDRM.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION

Movement Control in Sabah

ACTIVITY

- Cross-border activities are allowed according to the designated zones except for the districts below under Movement Control Order (MCO).
- Division of District Zone
 - i. Zone 1: Kota Kinabalu, Kota Belud, Ranau, Tuaran, Penampang, Putatan dan Papar;
 - ii. Zone 2: Beaufort, Kuala Penyu dan Sipitang;
 - iii. Zone 3: Kudat, Kota Marudu dan Pitas;
 - iv. Zone 4: Beluran, Telupid, Kinabatangan dan Tongod;
 - v. Zone 5: Kunak, Semporna dan Kalabakan; dan
 - vi. Zone 6: Keningau, Tambunan, Tenom dan Nabawan.
 - Cross-district movement is only allowed within zones and inter-zone movement is not allowed except with the permission of PDRM..

ACTIVITY

BRIEF DESCRIPTION

Activities in CMCO areas

- Business / economic / industrial activities are **ALLOWED** to operate as determined by the Government.
- Supermarkets, shopping malls and retail stores are **ALLOWED** to operate according to the prescribed SOPs between 6:00 am and 12:00 am.
- Restaurants, shops / dining outlets, food trucks, roadside hawkers, mobile hawkers, food court / hawker centres, roadside stalls / kiosks, grocery and convenience stores are ALLOWED to operate between 6:00am and 12:00 am with compliance to the Food Sector SOP.
- Restaurants, shops / food stalls, food trucks, roadside hawkers, street hawkers, food courts / hawker centers, roadside food stalls / kiosks and fast food outlets as well food delivery services that provide **sahur meals** are allowed to continue operations until 6.00 am during the month of Ramadan only.
- Restaurants and eateries are ALLOWED to operate on a dine-in basis (WITH DISTANCING OF 1 METER BETWEEN CUSTOMERS in accordance with table size), take-away, delivery or drive-through with compliance to the Food Sector SOP (Premised Businesses, Non-Premised Hawkers, Indoor Markets and Retail / Convenience Stores). Operational hours are allowed from 6:00 am to 12.00 midnight (subject to license terms).
- Day markets, wholesale markets, wet markets, night markets and Late Night Markets (uptown, downtown and the like) are in accordance with the starting operational hours set by the license / permit until 12.00 midnight with compliance to the SOP and supervision by the authorities as well as RELA / Local Authority personnel.
- Ramadan Bazaars are **ALLOWED** to operate between 3:00 pm until 8:00pm with compliance to SOPs and supervision by the authorities as well as RELA / Local Authority personnel.
- Aidilfitri Bazaars are **ALLOWED** to operate between 10:00 am until 2:00 am with compliance to the Ramadan Bazaar and Aidilfitri Bazaar SOP.





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Activities in CMCO areas	 Petrol station operating hours are between 6:00am and 12.00 midnight (except for the operation of petrol stations on highways which can operate 24 hours). Laundry services are ALLOWED from 6:00 am to 12.00 midnight. Spa, reflexology, massage, wellness including pedicure and manicure services are ALLOWED from 6:00 am to 12.00 midnight or in accordance with Local Authority license terms, whichever is earlier. Other business operations for daily needs are ALLOWED from 6:00am to 12.00 midnight (subject to license terms).
Medical / Health Services	 Government and private clinics and hospitals are ALLOWED to operate for 24 hours or as permitted by the Government. Pharmacies and drug stores can operate from 8:00 am to 12.00 midnight.

Health Protocols

ACTIVITY

- The license holder and premise owner to ensure the movement of customers in and out of the premises is with 1 meter physical distancing.
- Hand sanitizer must be provided at entrances and to ensure it is used before entry.
- It is mandatory for the license holder and premise owner to provide a MySejahtera QR code and a registration log book for customer attendance.
- Use of the MySejahtera application is mandatory in areas with extensive internet access. Exemption is allowed for areas that do not have internet access, specifically villages and rural areas.
- The license holder and premise owner to ensure customers check-in to the premises using MySejahtera or to manually write down their name and contact number if there is no internet.
- It is mandatory for customers / visitors to check-in with MySejahtera or to write their name and telephone number manually and legibly before entering the premises.
- For shopping centers / hypermarkets / departmental stores, customers need to have their body temperature screened **only once** at the entrance to the complex and not at every business premise within the same complex.
- Those with a body temperature above 37.5 degree Celsius are **NOT ALLOWED** to enter the premises.
- Owners of the complex and external complex premises need to ensure that only customers with a "Low Risk" status in MySejahtera are allowed into their respective complex / premises.
- The premise owner and license holder needs to ensure only customers with "Low Risk" status in MySejahtera, are allowed to enter their respective complexes / premises.

Health Protocols

ACTIVITY

- The premise owner and license holder to limit the number of customers in the premises with a 1 meter radius physical distancing at any given time and to display the maximum number of customers within the premises.
- Each premise needs to display the total number of customer entry limits at any one time. Use of a queue system should be encouraged for customers entering premises.
- Employees, suppliers and customers are required to wear face masks as recommended MOH while on the premises.
- Ensure good ventilation system in the premises.
- It is compulsory to wear a face mask especially when in a crowded public place **EXCEPT** for the following activities and places:
 - a. Own residence and involving household members;
 - b. Hotel Room/Individual Paid Accommodation and involving members of the household;
 - c. Solitary work space
 - d. Indoor and outdoor sports & recreation activities;
 - e. Own vehicle and involving household members
 - f. Indoor / outdoor public areas and places without any other individuals; and
 - g. When eating and drinking in public without any other individual.

ACTIVITY	BRIEF DESCRIPTION
Employment Activity	 Movement in and out of MCO, CMCO and RMCO AREAS IS ALLOWED. Employee movement is subject to an employer confirmation letter / employee pass or an operations approval letter / business license from the Local Authority (for the self-employed). Movement into EMCO areas IS NOT ALLOWED. Employee attendance capacity for the civil service is based on JPA Circulars / Orders. Whereas the attendance capacity of workers allowed for the private sector is 100% for the management and operations / support group. Vehicles carrying employees including private vehicles are ALLOWED to operate with SOP compliance.
Economic and Industrial Sector Activities	 Economic and industrial sector activities in CMCO areas can operate as determined by the Government with compliance to prescribed SOPs. All industrial, business and manufacturing related vehicles are ALLOWED to operate, including to cross districts and states.
Fisheries, Plantation and Agriculture Sectors	The fisheries, plantation, agriculture and livestock and all other sectors related to the food supply chain are ALLOWED to operate.
Religious Activities	 Activities in the mosques and <i>suraus</i> are ALLOWED with restricted attendance as determined by the State Religious Authority. Activities in non-Muslim houses of worship are ALLOWED with restricted attendance as determined by the Ministry of National Unity and the Ministry of Federal Territories for houses of worship in the Federal Territories.

ACTIVITY BRIEF DESCRIPTION

Sports and Recreational Activities

- All individual and team sports and recreational activities for the purposes of health, fitness, training and games / matches are SUBJECT to the Sports and Recreational Sector SOP including the effective movement control order in place and permission from the relevant Authoritative Body.
- The hosting of tournaments / competitions at the state / district / community level **WITH** permission from the Ministry of Youth and Sports (KBS).
- The hosting of tournaments / competitions at national level such as the MFL, MHL and STL Leagues while following the Sports Bubble Model with permission from KBS. Inter-state movement is subject to **PERMISSION** from PDRM.
- The hosting of international tournaments / competitions using the Sports Bubble **WITH** the permission of KBS. The entry of players / participants / officials / technical staff is **SUBJECT** to the support of KBS and permission from the Immigration Department of Malaysia (JIM).
- The participation of Malaysian players / participants / officials / technical staff to tournaments / competitions overseas **WITH** the support of KBS and permission from the Immigration Department of Malaysia (JIM).
- The attendance of spectators / supporters to the sports and recreation venue is subject to 10% capacity of spectators / supporters or 2,000 individuals, whichever is lower. However, the organizer can set the attendance capacity limit of spectators / supporters (not to exceed the prescribed capacity) to take into account the ability to supervise and control.
- Controlled group activities with supervisory control such as aerobics, zumba, taichi and others with compliance to the Sports and Recreation Sector SOP. Participation is **LIMITED** to 50% of the area capacity or to not exceed 250 individuals (whichever is lower) at any given time.
- Operations of premises / facilities / sports and recreation facilities is according to the Sports and Recreation Sector SOP.





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ACTIVITY AND PROTOCOL

ACTIVITY BRIEF DESCRIPTION

Creative Industries

- All types of live events / shows / performances including official Government programs / music / dance / theater / arts / musical arts / comedy / culture and heritage performances / live streaming is ALLOWED WITH SPECTATORS limited to 50% of the event space capacity with compliance to physical distancing.
- Limited only to specialized locations and licensed event space such as convention centers, exhibition galleries, trade centers, arts premises and other licensed MICE premises.
- Performances at hotel lounges are **ALLOWED WITH SPECTATORS** limited to **50% of the event space capacity** with compliance to physical distancing.
- The total number of management, artists and crew is limited to 70% of the normal capacity.
- Creative Content Development activity including music production, animation and filming, drama and documentary
 filming conducted within and outside studios are ALLOWED. However, live television programs or recording within
 and outside studios is ALLOWED WITH SPECTATORS subject to 50% of the space capacity with physical
 distancing.
- Busking activity within building premises such as cafeterias, food courts, restaurants and shopping malls is **ALLOWED.**
- Cinema and drive through cinema activity is ALLOWED in CMCO areas.

Day Care Centres, *Tabika*s, Kindergartens and

Nurseries

- Day care centres, *tabika*s, kindergartens and nurseries are allowed to operate with permission to operate by the relevant Ministry / Agency.
- Parents / guardians sending their children to day care centres are allowed to use vehicles with a number of child passengers according to the capacity of the vehicle.
- Day care centres for People with Disabilities, Senior Citizens, Women and Multipurpose Care Centres are allowed to operate during the CMCO period.

ACTIVITY

BRIEF DESCRIPTION

Education

- Schools, Public and Private Institutes of Higher Learning (HEI), Vocational Institutes, *tahfiz* centers, private education institutions in the category of private kindergartens, schools and centers (such as tuition centers, language centers, skills centers, mental development centers and guidance centers) and other education institutions are **ALLOWED** with compliance to guidelines set by respective Ministries/Agencies.
- All educational institutes and private education institutions registered with the Ministry of Education (MOE) are allowed to operate according to the decision and announcements from MOE from time to time. Other institutions are encouraged to begin operations based on the announcement from MOE.
- Students and candidates sitting for the 2020 and 2021 Sijil Pelajaran Malaysia (SPM), Sijil Tinggi Pelajaran Malaysia (STPM), Sijil Vokasional Malaysia (SVM), Sijil Tinggi Agama Malaysia (STAM), Sijil Kemahiran Malaysia (SKM), Diploma Vokasional Malaysia (DVM), Admission to Special Schools for Form 1 and Form 4 Examinations and equivalent international examinations are allowed to attend school across MCO or RMCO areas in accordance with the school calendar as set by the Malaysian Ministry of Education (MOE) with confirmation documents from MOE.
- The movement of lecturers/teachers/instructors for the purpose of Lecturing and Teaching classes involved in examinations are allowed with confirmation from MOE and MOHE.
- Movement for the admission of students to dormitories for examination classes set by MOH and MOHE are allowed with confirmation from MOH and MOHE.
- Students must obtain a movement permission letter to cross states or districts to return to campus from the relevant HEI.

Seminars / Conferences / Workshops / Courses / Training / Lectures / Exhibitions	 All Seminars / Conferences / Workshops / Courses / Training / Lectures / Exhibitions are allowed to be held at 50% of the premise capacity with compliance to physical distancing, mandatory wearing of face masks and based on the General SOP for the Execution of Government and Private Sector Official Events.
Mass Ceremonies	 Government and Private Official and Non-Official Events, Social Events such as ceremonies, akad nikah ceremonies, weddings and engagements, receptions, aqiqah ceremonies, doa selamat, tahlil, anniversaries, birthday celebrations, reunions, retreats and other social gatherings are allowed to be held at 50% of the premise capacity with compliance to physical distancing, mandatory wearing of face masks and based on the General SOP for the Execution of Social Events.
Other Permitted Activities	Other activities not listed in the Negative List are ALLOWED based on existing SOPs which have been prescribed.

Sports and Recreational Activities	 The hosting of tournaments / competitions at the community / district / state / national / international level WITHOUT the permission of the Ministry of Youth and Sports. The participation of Malaysian players / participants / officials / technical staff to tournaments / competitions overseas WITHOUT the support of KBS and permission from the Immigration Department of Malaysia (JIM). The entry of foreign players / officials / technical staff into Malaysia for the purposes of hosting a sports and recreational tournament / competition WITHOUT the support of KBS and permission from the Immigration Department of Malaysia (JIM). The attendance of spectators / supports to a sports and recreation venue EXCEEDING the permitted capacity WITHOUT supervisory control. Mass activities which would make physical distancing difficult such as fun runs, fun rides, marathons, triathlons and the like. 			
Tourism Activities	 Tourism activities to outside CMCO areas and within MCO and EMCO areas. International travel by citizens and domestic tourism involving foreign tourists entering Malaysia except for foreign tourists as declared by the Minister. 			
Other Prohibited Activities	 Inter-state movement without permission from the RMP. Any activity that can cause many people to attend in one place, making it difficult to conduct physical distancing and comply with orders by the Director-General of Health. Others as decided by the Government from time to time.
