# MEDIA STATEMENT THE DEPUTY PRIME MINISTER MINISTER OF DEFENSE

### 16 JULY 2021

# ON THE NATIONAL RECOVERY PLAN (NRP) & ENHANCED MOVEMENT CONTROL ORDER (EMCO)

The National Recovery Plan (NRP) is the Government's commitment in providing a clear strategy to address the COVID-19 pandemic. The government also regularly implements strict SOP enforcement measures including compliance operations, control actions and snap checks of business premises and factories.

Yesterday alone, 180 factories and business premises were prosecuted for not complying with the SOPs and today, 65 premises were also prosecuted.

The government will not compromise if there is a violation of directives and SOPs in any situation because what is the priority now is the safety and well -being of the people. If any of the premises are still stubborn and violate the instructions of the authorities, harsh action including an immediate closure order will be imposed.

#### **Termination of EMCO 34 Districts in Selangor**

The government has implemented the Enhanced Movement Control Order (EMCO) in 34 districts in the state of Selangor which is scheduled to end today, 16 July 2021.

The NSC Special Session examined the presentation of the Ministry of Health Malaysia (MOH) on the current situation and agreed not to extend the EMCO in all the districts involved.

# **Implementation of EMCO**

The Special Session of the NSC examined the presentation of the MOH and after taking into account the risk assessment and trend of COVID-19 infection, agreed agreed to impose EMCO in the following localities

#### **SOP COVID-19 in the Manufacturing Sector and Business Premises**

The government has stepped up comprehensive enforcement in terms of inspections on factories and business premises as there has been an increase in incidents of violations of government directives and gazetted SOPs.

Yesterday the Compliance Operations Task Force Team conducted 84,976 inspections and snap checks of COVID-19 nationwide with a total strength of 19,133 personnel.

It includes inspections of 2,309 factories, 14,237 business premises, 833 construction sites and 322 dormitories.

As a result of the inspection, a total of 65 premises covering factories, business premises and construction sites were ordered to close for failing to comply with SOPs set by the government.

#### **Compliance Operations Task Force**

The Compliance Operations Task Force led by the Royal Malaysian Police (PDRM) conducted 84,976 inspections yesterday.

It involves 4,317 Compliance Teams comprising 19,133 members to monitor and enforce compliance with Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) throughout the Movement Control Order (MCO).

Yesterday, 416 individuals were arrested for SOP default. Of that number, a total of 404 individuals were compounded while another 12 were remanded.

The public is reminded to always adhere to established SOPs and practice self-control in an effort to break the chain of COVID-19 infection.

# **National Border Control**

Operation BENTENG (Op BENTENG) yesterday arrested 57 Illegal Immigrants (PATI) and confiscated nine (9) land vehicles.

In the operation, a total of four (4) boats/ships and a land vehicle were also detected in national waters through four (4) sight activities.

Op BENTENG involves the Royal Malaysian Police (PDRM), the Malaysian Armed Forces (ATM), the Malaysian Maritime Enforcement Agency (APMM) and the Malaysian Border Security Agency (AKSEM) as well as other security agencies also carrying out 890 Roadblocks (SJR) yesterday, namely:

Op PENAWAR (ATM, PDRM and RELA) - 836 SJR Op **BENTENG PDRM - 45 SJR** Op BENTENG AKSEM - 9 SJR

#### **COVID-19 Disinfection Operation**

Yesterday, a total of 164 disinfection operations were carried out nationwide covering 67 red zones, orange zones (3) and yellow zones (8).

The disinfection operation involved 919 members of the Malaysian Fire and Rescue Department (JBPM) and 231 Local Authorities (PBT) as well as 166 JBPM machines.

Cumulatively, a total of 32,382 disinfection operations covering 157 zones were conducted since March 30, 2020. Sanitation operations involved business centers, housing areas including the People's Housing Project (PPR), public places, supermarkets and government buildings.

#### **Mandatory Quarantine**

Yesterday, a total of 673 individuals arrived at all international entrances and all were quarantined at quarantine stations across the country.

Cumulatively, since 24 July 2020, a total of 249,548 individuals have returned to the country and all of them are housed in 81 hotels and 10 Public Training Institutes (ILA) as well as Private Institute of Studies nationwide.

Of the total, a total of 8,988 individuals were quarantined and 237,289 people were allowed to return while another 3,271 were taken to hospital.

### **Basic Necessities**

Monitoring and inspection by the Enforcement members of the Ministry of Domestic Trade and Consumer Affairs (KPDNHEP) at the retail and wholesaler level found that the food supply was stable and adequate.

Yesterday, KPDNHEP conducted 734 daily monitors on 11 types of supply of goods comprising retailers (546), wholesalers (157) and manufacturers (31).

KPDNHEP also conducted 1,773 special inspections and of the total, 1,769 premises complied with the SOP while four (4) others were compounded.
