3. Complete Vaccination	Individuals who have been fully vaccinated are individuals who have met the following criteria: i. For vaccine types that require two doses of injection (Pfizer, AstraZeneca, and Sinovac), the individual must have passed the 14th day from the date of injection of the second dose; or ii. For vaccine types that require only one dose of injection (Johnson & Johnson and CanSino), the individual must have passed the 28th day from the date of injection.				



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4. General Health Protocol		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Licensees and premises owners are required to provide the MySejahtera QR Code facility and provide a customer attendance registration book. Hand sanitizer is provided at the entrance and its use is ensured before entering. The use of the MySejahtera application is mandatory in the area of wide internet access. The use of customer attendance registration books is only allowed in areas where there is no internet coverage or other reasonable reasons (senior citizens, absence of smartphones etc.). The licensee and the owner of the premises ensure that customers check in the premises using MySejahtera or manually write the name and no. phone if there is no internet coverage. Employers, employees, customers and visitors are required to check in MySejahtera or write manually the name and phone number that can be read (if there is no internet coverage) before entering the premises, including in Government offices, private and private. For shopping malls, supermarkets or department stores, customers only need to perform a body temperature scan once at the entrance of the complex and not at every business premises under one complex. Body temperatures above 37.5 degrees Celsius are not allowed to enter the complex and premises. The owners of complexes and premises outside the complex must ensure that only customers with "Low Risk" status including "Casual-Contact Low Risk" in MySejahtera are allowed to enter their respective complexes or premises.

General Health Protocol | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Individuals 17 years of age and under are not encouraged to be in place and public facilities. Licensees and premises owners limit the number of customers being on the premises with physical distancing of at least 1 meter at a time. Each premise must display the total number of customer entry limits at any one time. The use of a queue number system is encouraged for customers entering from a premise. All building owners are required to provide a QR Code on each level. Employees, suppliers and customers are required to wear face masks properly according to the MOH's recommendation while on the premises. Ensure good VENTILATION AND AIRING SYSTEM in the premises based on the guidelines for ventilation and indoor air quality issued by the Department of Occupational Safety and Health (DOSH). Citizens and Non-Citizens Returning/ Arriving from Abroad	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Citizen and non -citizen travelers who have a residence in Malaysia (including PR and Malaysia MY Second Home) who return or arrive from abroad and have been fully vaccinated, are allowed to undergo mandatory quarantine at home and are given a digital Home Surveillance and Observation Order (HSO) subject to the details issued by the Ministry of Health Malaysia (MOH). <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Demonstrate evidence of a valid negative RT PCR test report and conducted 3 days before departure. ➤ Have a complete COVID-19 vaccination validity certificate (depending on the type of vaccine). ➤ No symptoms during the health screening at the National International Gateway. ➤ Have a suitable residence to carry out quarantine. Individuals who return / arrive from abroad and have not been fully vaccinated or not vaccinated must undergo quarantine at a designated quarantine center and subject to the details issued by the Ministry of Health Malaysia (MOH). The mandatory quarantine period for travelers from all countries is 14 days and can be extended for another 7 days if there is a need based on the results of the risk assessment conducted on the 14th day. For travelers from India, Sri Lanka, Bangladesh, Nepal and Pakistan, the quarantine period is 21 days or as stipulated by the MOH. 				
9. Religious	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Prayer activities in mosques and suraus for individuals who have been fully vaccinated are allowed subject to regulations and SOPs by the State Religious Authority. Prayer activities at Houses of Worship Other than Islam (RISI) for individuals who have been fully vaccinated are allowed subject to regulations and SOPs by the Ministry of National Unity (IGP).

Couples who have received a complete vaccination are allowed to bring children aged 17 years and below to dine-in at the premises in accordance with general health protocols.

12. Tourism Activities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Tourism activities are only allowed in the same state involving hotels and homestays. Guests who have been fully vaccinated are allowed to undertake tourism activities in the same state by presenting the COVID-19 Digital Vaccination Certificate upon check-in. Hotel and homestay operators need to ensure individuals who wish to enter the premises MUST show a COVID-19 Digital Vaccination Certificate proving that the individual has been fully vaccinated. For couples who have received a complete vaccination are allowed to bring children aged 17 years and below for tourism activities in hotels and homestays by adhering to general health protocols.



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13. Movement Control	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Cross -district and state (based on district boundaries set by the State Government) is not allowed except: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Individuals who have been fully vaccinated for cross -district purposes only. Long -distance couples, long -distance children and individuals who have been approved for movement by the MOH and PDRM for cross -state purposes. PDRM is responsible for implementing control over local areas of infection with the help of ATM, APM & RELA. The entrance and exit of the NRP area is closed and entry is controlled by the PDRM. Movement for individuals who have been fully vaccinated is allowed based on the total capacity of the vehicle. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Only two (2) household representatives are allowed out just to get food supplies, medicines, dietary supplements and basic necessities. A maximum of three (3) people only including patients are allowed out to seek health care services, medical, screening tests, vaccination programs, safety or emergency. The number of passengers in taxis and e-hailing is limited to two (2) people only including the driver, passengers must sit in the back. The number of persons allowed in the vehicle carrying goods as well as the chain of economic or industrial activities (except transportation of workers) depends on the vehicle registration license. The number of people allowed in the Department Vehicle or the Official Car of the Post is based on the capacity of the vehicle. Activities and services at all airports and ports are allowed to operate 24 hours. Sea and land public transport services such as employee transport, stop buses, express buses, ferries and other public transport are allowed to operate based on 50% of vehicle capacity.

Movement Control</p> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Unloading activities involve non -essential goods in factories - factories are limited to the delivery and receipt of goods or cargo in the existing stockpile for the purpose of import and export only with a limited number of employees. Unloading time is from 8.00 am to 8.00 pm on Monday, Wednesday and Friday. Unloading activities involving essential goods are not subject to these restrictions and are running as usual. Movement for cases of death and natural disasters is allowed after obtaining permission from the PDRM. Disaster or humanitarian aid movements by NGOs need to get permission from The State Disaster Management Committee or the District Disaster Management Committee in the areas affected by the disaster and the assistance is channeled through the Disaster Operations Control Center (PKOB) in the area. Movement across districts and states for the purpose of COVID-19 vaccination at Vaccination Centers (PPVs) outside the district or state of residence is permitted by showing appointment details on the MySejahtera application, website or SMS. Members of Parliament and State Assemblymen are allowed across districts and states to visit their respective constituencies without performing any ceremony. Movement for Short -Term Business Visitors under the approval of the One Stop Center Initiative (OSC) for official or business purposes is allowed after obtaining permission from PDRM. Cross-district and state for long-distance married couples who have not received a complete vaccine are allowed between Phase 2 states with the permission of PDRM and submit; <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Copy of husband and wife's identity card ➤ Copy of marriage certificate/ card ➤ Copy of COVID-19 Digital Vaccination Certificate of husband and wife ➤ Copy of proof of residence of husband/ wife or employer's confirmation letter. |
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14. Public services	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Subject to the current direction of the Secretary of State. The operation of Government offices is implemented in a hybrid manner through being in the office and Working From Home (BDR) using the following approaches: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Office attendance does not exceed 60% for the whole (excluding frontliners, security, defense and enforcement services) and 40% BDR by rotation. Counter services are open subject to the current instructions of the Secretary General Country. Attendance to the office must be accompanied by official instruction documents and employee pass.

Private Services	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> All essential services sectors approved by the relevant Ministry or Agency may operate during the NRP period subject to the approval letter of the relevant Ministry. Business and Services	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Restaurants, eateries, food stalls, food trucks, roadside hawkers, street hawkers, food courts, hawker centers, roadside food stalls or kiosks are allowed to operate from 6.00 am to 10.00 pm by takeaway, drive or delivery. Dine-in and park & dine services are not allowed. Picnic activities are not allowed. Grocery stores, pharmacies, personal care stores, convenience stores and mini marts are allowed to operate from 6.00 am to 10.00 pm. Daily necessities shops such as hardware shops, vehicle workshops, baby goods shops and religious goods are allowed to operate from 6.00 am to 10.00 pm. Health services such as hospitals, clinics and medical laboratories can operate up to 24 hours or according to the operating permit license. Petrol stations are allowed to operate from 6.00 am to 10.00 pm except petrol stations on toll highways can operate for up to 24 hours. Supermarkets, hypermarkets and department stores are allowed to operate from 6.00 am until 10.00 pm. Book and stationery stores, computer and telecommunication stores and electrical goods stores are allowed to operate from 6.00 am to 10.00 pm. Barber shops (basic barber service only) and beauty salons (basic barber service only) are allowed to operate from 6.00 am to 10.00 pm. Animal clinics and pet food shops are allowed to operate from 6.00 am to 10.00 pm. Laundry shops, laundromats, car washes and eyewear shops are allowed to operate from 6.00 am to 10.00 pm. Self -service laundromats need to ensure that employees are on the premises in compliance with the prescribed SOPs.

Permanent Farmers Market (PTK), MyFarm Outlet (MFO) and Farmers Organization Complex Areas (PPK) are allowed to operate from 6.00 am to 4.00 pm. Organizing tournaments or competitions in quarantine and closed WITHOUT the presence of spectators/ supporters according to the Sports Bubble Model is RESTRICTED to those organized by the Ministry of Youth and Sports (KBS), Malaysian Football League and Petronas Cub Prix Championship only. Quarantine centralized training program implemented by the National Sports Council (MSN) and State Sports Councils (MSN Negeri) using the Camp Based concept Training.
