1. Areas Involved	<p>KELANTAN, TERENGGANU, PAHANG, PERAK, PENANG AND SABAH</p> <p>*For Sabah, please refer to the National Recovery Plan SOP Phase 2 Sabah.</p> <p>*For areas under an EMCO, the EMCO SOP for those areas are applicable until their respective expiry Dates</p>
2. Effective Period	Starting 16 August 2021 (from 12.01am)
3. Full Vaccination	<p>Individuals who have completed their vaccination are individuals who fulfil the following criteria</p> <p>i. For vaccines that require two doses (AstraZeneca, and Sinovac), the individual must have passed the 14th day from the date of the second dose or</p> <p>ii. For vaccines that only require one dose (Johnson & Johnson and CanSino), the individual must have passed the 28th day from the vaccination date</p>



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4. General Health Protocol	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The license holder and premise owner to ensure control on the entry and exit movement of customers on the premises with at least 1 meter physical distancing. It is mandatory for the license holder and premise owner to provide a MySejahtera QR code and a customer attendance registration book. Hand sanitizers are to be provided at entrances and to ensure its use before entry. Use of the MySejahtera app is mandatory in areas with extensive internet access. Use of the customer attendance registration book is only allowed for areas without internet access or for other reasonable reasons (senior citizens, no smartphone and others). The license holder and premise owner to ensure customers check-in to the premises using MySejahtera or to manually write down their name and telephone number if there is no internet access. It is mandatory for employers, workers, customers and visitors to check in with MySejahtera or to manually write down their name and telephone number legibly before entering the premises including at Government, private sector and individual offices. For shopping centres, supermarkets or departmental stores, customers only need to scan their body temperature once at the entrance to the complex and not at every business premise within one complex. A person with a body temperature of above 37.5 degree Celsius is not allowed to enter the complex and premises. The owner of the complex and premises outside the complex must ensure that only customers with the status “Low Risk” including “Casual Contact Low Risk” in the MySejahtera app are allowed inside their respective complex / premises. 				



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4. General Health Protocol	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Children under the age of 17 are not encouraged to be in public areas and facilities. The license holder and premise owner to limit the number of customers on the premises with physical distancing of at least 1 meter radius at any given time. Every premise must display the maximum number of customers at any given time. The use of a queue numbering system is encouraged for customers entering a premise. All building owners must provide a QR code for each floor. Employees, suppliers and customers are required to wear face masks correctly in accordance with MOH recommendations while on the premises. To ensure there is VENTILATION AND a good VENTILATION SYSTEM on the premises based on the ventilation and indoor air quality guidelines issued by the Department of Occupational Safety and Health (DOSH). It is mandatory to wear face masks especially while in congested public areas except for the following activities and areas: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Hotel rooms or privately paid accommodation involving members of the same household. Individual workspaces. Outdoor sports and recreational activities. Own vehicles involving members of the same household. Indoor or outdoor areas and public places without any other individual. While eating and drinking in public without any other individual (other than in restaurants or eateries).



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5. Inter-state District Travel	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Inter-district travel is allowed for individuals who have been fully vaccinated by producing a COVID-19 Vaccination Card/ Digital Certificate and identity card/ passport as proof. 				
6. Inter-District and Inter-State Movement for Long-Distance Married Couples (PJJ)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Long-distance spouses are allowed to cross states for the purpose of meeting their spouses provided that both must have been fully vaccinated with Royal Malaysian Police (PDRM) confirmation and produce: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ A copy of the husband and wife's identity card ➤ A copy of the marriage certificate/ card ➤ A copy of the husband and wife's COVID-19 Vaccination Card/ Digital Certificate ➤ A copy of documentary evidence of the husband/ wife's residence or employer confirmation letter. Showing a permission letter approved by PDRM when passing roadblocks (SJR). 				
7. Inter-District and Inter-State Movement for Parents/Guardian with Long-Distance Children (Below 18 Years)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Parents/ guardians who have children under the age of 18 residing in a different state are allowed to cross states to meet their respective children with the condition that both parents and/or guardian must be fully vaccinated with PDRM confirmation and produce <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ A copy of the parents' identity card and child's birth certificate/ document ➤ A copy of the parents' / guardians' COVID-19 Vaccination Card/ Digital Certificate ➤ The child's schooling information (if relevant) Showing a permission letter approved by PDRM when passing roadblocks (SJR). 				



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8. Citizens and Foreigners Returning/ Arriving from Overseas	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Citizens and foreign travelers with a residence in Malaysia (including PR and Malaysia MY Second Home) returning or arriving from abroad who are fully vaccinated are allowed to undergo mandatory quarantine at home and will be given a digital Home Surveillance and Observation Order (HSO) subject to further details issued by the Ministry of Health (MOH). <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Showing evidence of a negative RT PCR test report that is valid and conducted 3 days before departure Having a valid and complete COVID-19 vaccination certificate (dependent on the type of vaccine) No symptoms during the health screening conducted at Malaysia's International Arrival Gate Having a suitable residence to carry out quarantine Individuals returning arriving from abroad who have not been fully vaccinated or vaccinated at all must undergo quarantine at a designated quarantine center subject to further details issued by the Ministry of Health (MOH) The mandatory quarantine period for travelers from all countries is 14 days and can be extended for another 7 days if required based on the risk assessment result conducted on the 14 th day 				
9. Religion	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Prayer activities in mosques and suraus for fully vaccinated individuals are allowed subject to the regulations and SOPs prescribed by the State Religious Authority Prayer activities in Non-Muslim Houses of Worship (RISI) for fully vaccinated individuals are allowed and is subject to the regulations and SOPs prescribed by the Ministry of National Unity

FREEDOMS FOR FULLY VACCINATED INDIVIDUALS

Activity	Brief Description
10. Dine-in	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Restaurant operators including hotels, sports and recreation club houses, eateries, food stalls, catering vehicles, roadside hawkers, mobile hawkers, food courts, hawker centers, roadside food stalls and kiosks are allowed to provide dine-in services subject to the following conditions: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Only accepting customers who have been fully vaccinated and display at the entrance of the business premises a notice of acceptance of customers who are fully vaccinated only. ➤ Owners of business premises engaging in dine-in activities must display at the entrance of the business premises the number of employees who are fully vaccinated. ➤ The owner of the business premises must ensure that the table layout is appropriately distanced and the premises have a good ventilation system. ➤ Dine-in activities with a 50% capacity per table and physical distancing of at least 1 meter, subject to the KPDNHEP NRP Phase 2 Distributive Trade SOP . Couples who are fully vaccinated are allowed to bring children age 17 and under to dine-in at such premises with compliance to general health protocols.
11. Sports and Leisure	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Dine-in activities in a restaurant or cafe on the club house premises are allowed. However, the operations of dressing rooms or bathrooms on the club house premises are not allowed.



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12. Tourist Activities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Tourist activities are only allowed in the same state involving hotels and homestays. Guests who are fully vaccinated are allowed to undertake tourism activities in the same state by presenting a COVID-19 Vaccination Card/Digital Certificate upon check in. The operator of the hotel and <i>homestay</i> must make sure that individuals who wish to enter the premises MUST show a COVID-19 Vaccination Card/ Digital Certificate proving that the individuals have been fully vaccinated. Couples who are fully vaccinated are allowed to bring children of age 17 years and under for tourist activities at hotels and homestays with compliance to general health protocols.



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13. Manufacturing and Construction Sector	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> For the manufacturing and construction sector that have achieved a full vaccination rate for the workforce as follows <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a) 40% : Allowed to operate with 60% workforce capacity b) 60% : Allowed to operate with 80% workforce capacity c) 80% : Allowed to operate with 100% workforce capacity For RTK Antigen tests to be conducted on workers every 2 weeks with the cost borne by the employer
14. Mining and Quarrying Sector	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> For the mining and quarrying sector that have achieved a full vaccination rate for the workforce as follows <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a) 80% - 100% : Allowed to operate with 100% workforce capacity b) Less than 80% : Allowed to operate with only 80% workforce capacity For RTK Antigen tests to be conducted on workers every 2 weeks with the cost borne by the employer



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15. Trade and Distribution Sector	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Only allowed for states in Phase 1 that have achieved 50% full vaccination for the adult population in the state concerned. Customers accorded this freedom must also be fully vaccinated. <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Photography goods stores and photography services Second-hand stores Florists and nurseries Handicraft and souvenir stores Antique stores Toy stores Carpet stores Creative content and creative industry equipment stores Outdoor equipment stores (including camping, fishing equipment etc.) Cosmetics, skin care and perfume stores Tobacco stores (including vape and electronic cigarettes) Household goods and kitchen utensil stores Furniture stores Sports equipment stores Car accessories stores Car distribution and sales centers Morning markets and farmers markets only Clothing, fashion and accessory stores Jewelry stores <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The premise owner must ensure customers who wish to enter the premises MUST show a COVID-19 Vaccination Card/ Digital Certificate which proves the customer has been fully vaccinated.

16. Markets	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Customers who have this convenience must be fully vaccinated. Only morning markets and farmers' markets are allowed to operate by ensuring customers who wish to enter the morning market and farmers' market area MUST show a COVID-19 Vaccination Card/ Digital Certificate which proves the customer has been fully vaccinated.



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17. Movement Control	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Inter-district and inter-state movement (based on the district borders set by the State Government) is not allowed except for: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Individuals who have been fully vaccinated for inter-district movement only. Long-distance married couples, long-distance children and individuals approved to travel by MOH and PDRM for inter-state movement. The PDRM is responsible for exercising control over infected areas with the assistance of ATM, APM & RELA. Entry and exit routes of NRP areas are closed and entry is controlled by the PDRM. Movement for individuals who have been fully vaccinated is allowed based on the total capacity of the vehicle. Meanwhile, for those who have not been fully vaccinated: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Only two (2) household representatives are allowed out just to get food supplies, medicines, dietary supplements and basic necessities A maximum of three (3) people only including patients are allowed out to seek health care services, medical, screening tests, vaccination programs, safety or emergency. The number of passengers allowed in a taxi and e-hailing is limited to only two (2) people including the driver, the passenger must sit at the back. The number of people allowed in a vehicle carrying goods as well as for the economic or industry activity chain (except for worker transport) is dependent on the commercial vehicle registration license. The number of people allowed in a Department Vehicle or an Official Post Car is based on the capacity of the vehicle. Activities and services at all airports and ports are allowed to operate 24 hours. Public land and sea transportation services such as worker transport, bus stops, express buses, ferries and other public transport are allowed to operate based on 50% of the vehicle capacity.

18. Civil Service	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Subject to the current orders of the Chief Secretary to the Government (KSN). Government office operations are conducted on a hybrid basis through physical presence at the office and Work From Home (WFH) using the following approach: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➢ Attendance at the office does not exceed 60% of the total (not including frontliners, security, defence and enforcement services) and 40% WFH on rotation. ➢ Counter services are open subject to the current orders of the Chief Secretary to the Government (KSN). ➢ Attendance to the office must be accompanied by an official order document and employee pass. 				
19. Private Sector	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> All essential service sectors approved by the relevant Ministry or Agency can operate during the NRP period subject to an approval letter of the relevant Ministry effective 1 June 2021. The movement of workers is subject to the registration or operating approval letter or employee pass or employer confirmation letter. Employee attendance capacity for the private sector in the essential services including operations and management is limited to 80%. 				
20. Meetings	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Meetings must be conducted via video conferencing. 				
21. Seminars, Workshops, Courses, Training and Lectures	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Seminars, workshops, courses, training and lectures are not allowed except for ongoing internal training that can be conducted in training areas through the Camp Based Training method. Seminars, workshops, courses, training and lectures conducted online are allowed. Critical interviews which must be conducted face-to-face and online are allowed.

22. Business and Services	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Restaurant operators including hotels, sports and recreation club houses, eateries, food stalls, food trucks, roadside hawkers, mobile hawkers, food courts, hawker centres, mobile hawkers, hawker centers, roadside stalls or kiosks, are allowed to operate between 6:00am to 10:00pm. Food sale activities are by takeaway, drive-through or delivery EXCEPT for dine-in services for fully vaccinated customers. Park & dine services are not allowed. Picnic activities are not allowed. Grocery stores, pharmacies, personal care stores, convenience stores and mini marts allowed operate from 6.00am to 10.00pm. Daily necessity stores such as hardware stores, vehicle workshops, baby goods and religious goods stores are allowed to operate between 6.00am to 10.00pm. Healthcare services such as hospitals, clinics, and medical laboratories can operate 24 hours or in accordance with their operational license. Petrol stations are allowed to operate from 6.00am to 10.00pm except for petrol stations on highways which can operate 24 hours. Supermarkets, hypermarkets, and departmental stores are allowed to operate from 6.00am to 10.00pm. Book and stationery stores, computer and telecommunication stores and electrical goods stores allowed operate from 6.00 am to 10.00 pm. Hairdresser salons (basic haircut services only) and beauty salons (basic haircut services only) are allowed to operate from 6.00am to 10.00pm. Veterinarians and pet food stores are allowed to operate from 6.00am to 10.00pm. Laundry services, self-service laundromats, car wash operators, and optical stores are allowed to operate from 6.00am to 10.00pm. Self-service laundromats must ensure an employee is on the premises with adherence to the prescribed SOP.

23. Markets	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Day markets and public markets are allowed to operate from 6:00am to 4:00pm subject to the local authorities (LA) with compliance to SOPs and supervision of RELA or LA officers. Controlled Fresh Markets (<i>Pasar Segar Terkawal – PST</i>) are allowed to operate from 7:00am to 2:00pm. Permanent Farmers’ Markets (<i>Pasar Tani Kekal – PTK</i>), MyFarm Outlets (MFO) and Local Farmer Organization Complexes (<i>Komplex Pertubuhan Peladang Kawasan – PPK</i>) are allowed to operate from 6:00am to 4:00pm. Wholesale markets are allowed to operate from 12:01am to 6:00am and 11:00am to 4:00pm subject to the local authorities (LA) with compliance to SOPs and supervision of RELA or LA officers. Farmers’ Markets and Morning Markets are allowed to operate from 7:00am to 11:00am limited to main commodities as prescribed by the Ministry of Agriculture and Food Industries (MAFI). Morning markets and farmers’ markets are allowed to operate from 7:00am to 11:00am. Customers who wish to enter morning market and farmers’ market areas MUST show a COVID-19 Vaccination Card/ Digital Certificate that proves the customer has been fully vaccinated. Night markets and weekly markets are not allowed to operate. 				
24. Agriculture, Fisheries, Livestock, Farming and Commodities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Refer to the List of Essential Services according to Sectors – Agriculture, Fisheries, Livestock, Farming and Commodities which are allowed to operate. Fishing activities for subsistence purposes are allowed. 				
25. Mining and Quarrying	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Mining and quarry operations are allowed with a workforce capacity subject to the Mining and Quarrying SOP.

26. Education	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> All schools under the Ministry of Education (MOE) and educational institutes registered under MOE are open to conduct face-to-face <i>Pengajaran dan Pembelajaran</i> (PdP) sessions limited to students/pupils sitting for the <i>Sijil Pelajaran Malaysia</i> (SPM), <i>Sijil Tinggi Persekolahan Malaysia</i> (STPM), <i>Sijil Vokasional Malaysia</i> (SVM), <i>Sijil Tinggi Agama Malaysia</i> (STAM), <i>Sijil Kemahiran Malaysia</i> (SKM), <i>Diploma Vokasional Malaysia</i> (DVM) and equivalent international examinations according to the calendar determined by the MOE. Students are allowed to cross districts and states to attend school by using a confirmation letter from MOE, MARA or relevant Ministry / Agency. The movement to and from school can be accompanied by a guardian. The movement of teachers or lecturers to schools/educational institutions for the purpose of PdP classes involved in examinations are allowed with a confirmation letter from MOE, MARA or relevant Ministry / Agency. Movement for the admission of students to dormitories for examination classes set by MOE is allowed with a confirmation letter from MOE, MARA or relevant Ministry / Agency. For students who need to cross states from Peninsular Malaysia to Sabah, Sarawak and F.T. Labuan or vice versa must comply with the current COVID-19 screening and quarantine rules. International school and expatriate school students/pupils involved with international examinations are allowed to attend to sit for their examination according to the examination schedule set by the international examination body.

26. Education	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> All Public and Private Higher Educational Institutions (HEIs), Skills Training Institutes, schools other than those under the MOE, <i>tahfiz</i> centers and other educational institutions were closed. HEIs under the supervision of MOHE continue online. All face-to-face Teaching and Learning activities are not allowed except for HEIs students in need. International examinations and professional bodies as well as research activities which require laboratory facilities at HEIs are allowed in accordance with the relevant HEI SOP and movement must be accompanied by a confirmation letter from the Ministry of Higher Education (MOHE) or relevant HEI. Students in boarding schools, universities or educational institutes are allowed to be in the boarding school, university or institution and continue hybrid learning.

27. <i>Tabikas</i> , Childcare Centers, Kindergartens, Daycare Centers and Residential Daycare Centers	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <i>Tabikas</i>, childcare centers, daycare centers, private kindergartens, kindergartens in private, international and expatriate schools as well as mind development centers for children between the ages of 4 and 6 are not allowed to operate except for children whose parents and guardians are both frontliners and working in essential services. Residential care centers or rehabilitation centers for children, People with Disabilities, senior citizens, women and multi-purpose care centers are allowed to operate in accordance with the SOPs prescribed under the relevant Ministry, Department or Agency. Parents or guardians sending children to childcare centers are allowed to in accordance with the vehicle capacity.
28. Religion	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Prayer activities at mosques and <i>suraus</i> are allowed for fully vaccinated individuals subject to the regulations and SOPs prescribed by the State Religious Authority. Islamic wedding ceremonies (akad nikah) are allowed only at the Islamic Religious Office / Department with attendance in accordance with the ruling of the State Religious Authority. Muslim funeral arrangements are allowed in accordance with the State Religious Authority directives. Prayer activities at Non-Muslim Houses of Worship are allowed for fully vaccinated individuals subject to the regulations and SOPs prescribed by the Ministry of National Unity (KPN). The registration of marriages for non-Muslims at the National Registration Department (NRD), Houses of Worship and Religious Associations is allowed with attendance according to NRD directives. Non-Muslim funeral arrangements are allowed in accordance with the Ministry of National Unity directives.

29. Sports and Leisure	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> All non-contact sports and recreational activities carried out individually for the purpose of health, exercise and self-training with compliance to physical distancing of at least 2 to 3 meters and carried out in outdoor spaces including partially-outdoor spaces from 6.00am to 10.00pm and are subject to the movement control order currently in force. Such activities include jogging, exercising, taichi, cycling, skateboarding, fishing, equestrian, archery, hiking, tennis (single), golf, motoring and the like. The operations of all outdoor sports and commercial recreational facilities including those partially-outdoor with compliance to 60% capacity usage / area WITH supervisory control. The attendance of workers should not exceed 60% workforce capacity encompassing management and operations. Whereas the operations of outdoor sports and recreational and partially-outdoor public facilities are SUBJECT to the Local Authorities (LA). The operations of all sports and recreational facilities OTHER THAN outdoor and partially-outdoor facilities are LIMITED to essential management purposes (finance, maintenance and the like) only with compliance of not exceeding 30% workforce capacity. The organizing of private tournaments or competitions with quarantine WITHOUT the attendance of spectators / supports using the Sports Bubble Model is LIMITED to those hosted by the Ministry of Youth and Sports (KBS), Malaysian Football League and the Petronas Cub Prix Championship only.

29. Sports and Leisure	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Central training programs including training matches with quarantine for teams in the Malaysian Football League (MFL) using the Sports Bubble Model (Camp Based Training) Central training programs with quarantine organized by the National Sports Council (MSN) and State Sports Councils (State MSNs) using the Camp Based Training concept. The entry of Malaysian athletes / coaches / officials / technicians to overseas tournaments or competitions or matches is SUBJECT to approval by the Department of Immigration, Malaysia WITH the support of KBS/MSN. 				
31. Creative Industries	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Development and broadcasting of creative content through recordings or live broadcasts including animation, filming, drama, promotions, sitcoms and the like, including dance arts, theatre arts, musical arts, cultural and heritage performances as well as musical art activities are not allowed except for individual talks and live streaming. Broadcast by recording or live broadcast programs in the form of information presentation (other than entertainment) such as news, forums, talks are allowed. Outdoor filming is allowed with strict compliance to the SOP issued by the National Film Development Corporation Malaysia (FINAS). 				
32. Other Activities	ANY ACTIVITY NOT STATED IN THIS SOP IS NOT PERMITTED.
