Activity	Brief Description
1. Areas Involved	<p>PERLIS, SARAWAK AND THE FEDERAL TERRITORY OF LABUAN.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> For Sarawak, please refer to the National Recovery Plan – Sarawak SOP Phase 3 For the Federal Territory of Labuan, this SOP needs to be read together with the National Recovery Plan Phase 3 - Special SOP for Federal Territory of Labuan. <p>** For areas enforced by EMCO, the EMCO SOP in those areas are in effect until their respective expiry dates</p>
2. Effective Period	Commencing 16 August 2021 (commencing 12:01 am)
3. Fully Vaccinated	<p>Individuals who have been fully vaccinated are individuals who have met the following criteria:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> For vaccine types that require two doses (Pfizer, AstraZeneca, and Sinovac), the individual in question must have passed the 14th day from the date second dose injection; or For vaccine types that require only one dose (Johnson & Johnson and CanSino), the individual in question must have passed the 28th day from the date of injection.



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4. General Health Protocol	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> It is mandatory for the license holder and premise owner to provide a MySejahtera QR code and a customer attendance registration book. Hand sanitizers are to be provided at entrances and to ensure its use before entry. Use of the MySejahtera app is mandatory in areas with extensive internet access. Use of the customer attendance registration book is only allowed for areas without internet access or for other reasonable reasons (senior citizens, no smartphone and others). The license holder and premise owner to ensure customers check-in to the premises using MySejahtera or to manually write down their name and telephone number if there is no internet access. It is mandatory for employers, workers, customers and visitors to check in with MySejahtera or to manually write down their name and telephone number legibly before entering the premises including at Government, private sector and individual offices. For shopping centres, supermarkets or departmental stores, customers only need to scan their body temperature once at the entrance to the complex and not at every business premise within one complex. A person with a body temperature of above 37.5 degree Celsius is not allowed to enter the complex and premises. The owner of the complex and premises outside the complex must ensure that only customers with the status “Low Risk” including “Casual Contact Low Risk” in the MySejahtera app are allowed inside their respective complex / premises. The license holder and premise owner to ensure control on the entry and exit movement of customers on the premises with at least 1 meter physical distancing. 				



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4. General Health Protocol	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Individuals from ages 17 and under are not encouraged to be in public areas and facilities. • The license holder and premise owner to limit the number of customers on the premises with physical distancing of at least 1 meter radius at any given time. • Every premise must display the maximum number of customers at any given time. The use of a queue numbering system is encouraged for customers entering a premise. • All building owners must provide a QR code for each floor. • Employees, suppliers and customers are required to wear face masks correctly in accordance with MOH recommendations while on the premises. • To ensure there is VENTILATION AND a good VENTILATION SYSTEM on the premises based on the ventilation and indoor air quality guidelines issued by the Department of Occupational Safety and Health (DOSH). • It is mandatory to wear face masks especially while in congested public areas except for the following activities and areas: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a) Hotel rooms or privately paid accommodation involving members of the same household. b) Individual workspaces. c) Outdoor sports and recreational activities. d) Own vehicles involving members of the same household. e) Indoor or outdoor areas and public places without any other individual. f) While eating and drinking in public without any other individual (other than in restaurants or eateries).

Inter-District and Inter-State Movement for Long Distance Married Couples (PJJ)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Long-distance married couples are allowed to cross districts and states for the purpose of meeting their respective partners with the condition that both must have been fully vaccinated with PDRM confirmation and produce: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ A copy of the husband and wife's identity card ➤ A copy of the marriage certificate/ card ➤ A copy of the husband and wife's COVID-19 Vaccination Card/ Digital Certificate ➤ A copy of documentary evidence of the husband/ wife's residence or employer confirmation letter. Showing a permission letter approved by PDRM when passing roadblocks (SJR).
6. Inter-District and Inter-State Movement for Parents/ Guardians with Long Distance Children (Below 18 Years)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Parents/ guardians who have children under the age of 18 residing in a different district or state are allowed to cross districts and states to meet their respective children with the condition that both parents / guardian must be fully vaccinated with PDRM confirmation and produce: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ A copy of the parents' identity card and child's birth certificate/ document ➤ A copy of the parents' / guardian's COVID-19 Vaccination Card/ Digital Certificate ➤ The child's schooling information (if relevant) Showing a permission letter approved by PDRM when passing roadblocks (SJR).

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7. Citizens and Foreigners Returning/ Arriving from Overseas	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Citizens and foreign travellers with a residence in Malaysia (including PR and Malaysia MY Second Home) returning or arriving from abroad who are fully vaccinated are allowed to undergo mandatory quarantine at home and will be given a digital Home Surveillance and Observation Order (HSO) subject to further details issued by the Ministry of Health (MOH). <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Showing evidence of a negative RT-PCR test report that is valid and conducted 3 days before departure. ➤ Having a valid and complete COVID-19 vaccination certificate (dependent on the type of vaccine). ➤ No symptoms during the health screening conducted at Malaysia’s International Arrival Gate. ➤ Having a suitable residence to carry out quarantine. • Individuals returning / arriving from abroad who have not been fully vaccinated or vaccinated at all must undergo quarantine at a designated quarantine center subject to further details issued by the Ministry of Health (MOH). • The mandatory quarantine period for travellers from all countries is 14 days and can be extended for another 7 days if required based on the risk assessment result conducted on the 14th day

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8. Religion	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Prayer activities in mosques and <i>suraus</i> for fully vaccinated individuals are allowed subject to the regulations and SOPs prescribed by the State Religious Authority. Prayer activities in Non-Muslim Houses of Worship (RISI) for fully vaccinated individuals are allowed subject to the regulations and SOPs prescribed by the Ministry of Unity.
9. Tourism Activities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Tourism activities are only allowed in the same state only that involving hotels and <i>homestays</i>. Guests who have been fully vaccinated are allowed domestic tourism activities by submitting COVID-19 Vaccination Card/ Digital Certificate upon checking-in. Hotel and homestay operators need to ensure individuals who wish to enter the premises MUST show a COVID-19 Digital Vaccination Certificate proving the individual have been fully vaccinated. Couples who have received a complete vaccination are allowed to bring children aged 17 years and below for tourism activities in hotels and homestays by adhering to general health protocols.

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10. Manufacturing and Construction Sector, Mining and Quarrying	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • For the manufacturing and construction sector that have achieved a full vaccination rate for the workforce as follows: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a) 80% : Allowed to operate with 100% workforce capacity. b) Less than 80%: Allowed to operate with up to 80% workforce capacity only. • RTK Antigen tests to be conducted on workers every 2 weeks with the cost borne by the employer.

11. Movement Control	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Inter-district movement within the same state is allowed. • Inter-state movement (based on district boundaries set by the State Government) is not allowed except for long -distance spouses, long-distance children and individuals who have approved travel permission by MOH and RMP. • The Royal Malaysian Police (RMP) is responsible for exercising control over infected areas with the assistance of ATM, APM & RELA. Entry and exit routes of MCO areas are closed and entry is controlled by the RMP. • Movement for individuals who have been fully vaccinated is allowed based on the capacity of the vehicle. • However, for those who have not been fully vaccinated: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➢ Only three (3) people from the same household are allowed to go out to only obtain food supplies, medicine, supplements and basic necessities. ➢ A maximum of three (3) people including the patient is allowed to go out to obtain healthcare services, medication, test screening, vaccination program, safety or emergency. • The number of passengers allowed in a taxi and e-hailing is limited to only three (3) people including the driver, the passenger must be seated at the back. • The number of people allowed in a vehicle carrying goods as well as for the economic or industry activity chain including worker transport is dependent on the commercial vehicle registration license. • The number of people allowed in a Department Vehicle or an Official Post Car is based on the capacity of the vehicle. • Activities and services at all airports and ports are allowed to operate 24 hours.



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11. Movement Control	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Public land and sea transportation services such as bus stops, express buses, ferries and other public transport are allowed to operate based on full vehicle capacity. Unloading activities on premises, at factories and ports are allowed. Movement in cases of death, natural disaster is allowed after obtaining permission from the RMP. Movement for disaster or humanitarian relief by NGOs must obtain permission from the State Disaster Management Committee or District Disaster Management Committee in the affected area and the assistance must be channelled through the Disaster Operations Control Center in that area. Inter-district and inter-state movement for the purpose of COVID-19 vaccination in Vaccination Centres (<i>Pusat Pemberian Vaksin [PPV]</i>) in a district or state outside their residential area is allowed by showing appointment details through the MySejahtera app, online or SMS. State Assemblymen and Members of Parliament are allowed to cross districts and states to visit their respective constituency. Movement for Short Term Business Travellers under the One Stop Centre (OSC) Initiative for official or business purposes is allowed subject to permission from the RMP. Crossing states and districts for long distance married couples who have been fully vaccinated are allowed between Phase 3 and Phase 2 states with the RMP permission and presenting below: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Copy of couples identification cards ➤ Copy of marriage certificate/card ➤ Copy of proof of residence of husband/ wife or employer's confirmation letter.



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12. Civil Service	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Subject to the current orders of the Chief Secretary to the Government (KSN). • Government office operations are conducted on a hybrid basis through physical presence at the office and Work From Home (WFH) using the following approach: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ☐ Attendance at the office does not exceed 80% of the total (not including frontliners, security, defence and enforcement services) and 20% WFH on rotation. ☐ Counter services are open subject to the current orders of the Chief Secretary to the Government (KSN). ☐ Attendance to the office must be accompanied by an official order document and employee pass.
13. Private Sector	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Inter-state movement of workers is subject to the registration or operating approval letter or employee pass or employer confirmation letter. • Employee attendance capacity for the private sector in the essential services including operations and management is limited to 80%.



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14. Meetings	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Face-to-face meetings of Government and private agencies are allowed WITHOUT involving the presence of external agency representatives with 50% capacity and physical distancing. • Meetings involving external agencies are encouraged to be carried out through video conferencing.
15. Seminars, Workshops, Courses, Training and Lectures	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Seminars, workshops, courses, trainings and talks are not allowed except for ongoing internal training that can be conducted in training areas through the Camp Based Training method. • Seminars, workshops, courses, trainings and talks conducted online are allowed. • Critical interviews which must be conducted face-to-face and online are allowed.
16. Official Ceremonies	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Official ceremonies are allowed with 50% capacity of the premises with physical distancing.



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17. Business and Services	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Restaurant operators including those at hotels, sports and recreation club houses, eateries, food stalls, food trucks, roadside hawkers, mobile hawkers, food courts, hawker centers, roadside food stalls or kiosks are allowed operate from 6.00 am to 12.00 midnight. Food sale activities can be on a dine-in, take-away, drive-through or delivery basis. Dine-in activities must be with physical distancing of at least 1 meter subject to the MDTCA NRP Phase 3 – Distributive Trade SOP. Healthcare services such as hospitals, clinics, medical laboratories, veterinary hospitals and veterinary clinics can operate up to 24 hours or in accordance with their operating permit license. Petrol stations are allowed to operate from 6.00am to 12.00 midnight except for petrol stations on highways which can operate 24 hours. All distributive trade sectors are allowed operate from 6.00am to 12.00 midnight or in accordance with the terms of the license. Spas, reflexology, massage centers, wellness and pedicure and manicure services are not allowed to operate.



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18. Markets	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Daily markets and public markets are allowed to operate from 6:00am to 4:00pm subject to the local authorities (LA) with compliance to SOPs and supervision of RELA or LA officers. Controlled Fresh Markets (<i>Pasar Segar Terkawal – PST</i>) are allowed to operate from 7:00am to 2:00pm. Permanent Farmers’ Markets (<i>Pasar Tani Kekal – PTK</i>), MyFarm Outlets (MFO) and Local Farmer Organization Complexes (<i>Kompleks Pertubuhan Peladang Kawasan – PPK</i>) are allowed to operate from 6:00am to 6:00pm. Wholesale markets are allowed to operate from 12:01 am to 6:00am and 11:00am to 4:00pm subject to the local authorities (LA) with compliance to SOPs and supervision of RELA or LA officers. Farmers’ markets and morning markets are allowed to operate from 7:00am to 1:00pm. Night markets and weekly markets are allowed to operate in accordance with their license/permit up to 12:00 midnight with compliance to SOPs and supervision of the authorities as well as RELA/LA officers. 				
19. Agriculture, Fisheries, Livestock, Farming, Commodities, Logging, Manufacturing and Construction	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Agriculture, fisheries, livestock, farming, commodities and logging as well as their supply chains are allowed to operate. Manufacturing and construction as well as their supply chains are allowed to operate. 				
20. Mining and Quarrying	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Mining and quarry operations are allowed subject to the Mining and Quarrying SOP.

21. Education	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All schools and educational institutions under the MOE and registered educational institutions under KPM to open with the admission of pupils/students in stages subject to MOE's ruling by taking into account the risk assessment by MOH and NSC • Movement for the admission of students to dormitories for examination classes set by MOE is allowed with confirmation from MOE, MARA or relevant Ministry / Agency. • For students who need to cross states from Peninsular Malaysia to Sabah, Sarawak and F.T. Labuan or vice versa must comply with the current quarantine rules. • International schools and expatriate schools are allowed to open. • The movement of teachers or lecturers for the purpose of Teaching and Learning classes involved in examinations are allowed with confirmation from MOE, MARA or relevant Ministry / Agency. • All Public and Private Institutes of Higher Learning (IPT), Skills Training Institutes, schools other than under the Ministry of Education Malaysia (MOE), tahfiz centers and institutions other education is opened. • All Teaching and Learning activities face to face/ group/ clustering is allowed by complying with the SOP set limited to 70% student capacity in higher education institutions. • International examinations and professional bodies as well as research activities which require laboratory facilities at HEIs are allowed in accordance with the relevant HEI SOP and movement must be accompanied by confirmation from the Ministry of Higher Education (MOHE) or relevant HEI. • Industrial Training is allowed in accordance with the enforced SOPs • Students in boarding school, universities or educational institutes are allowed to be in the boarding school, university or institution and continue hybrid learning.

Residential care centers or rehabilitation centers for children, People with Disabilities, senior citizens, women and multi-purpose care centers are allowed to operate in accordance with the SOPs prescribed under the relevant Ministry, Department or Agency. 				
23. Religion	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Activities at mosques and <i>suraus</i> are allowed in accordance with State Religious Authority directives. The Muslim <i>akad nikah</i> is allowed in accordance with State Religious Authority directives. Muslim funeral arrangements are allowed in accordance with State Religious Authority directives. Non-Muslim House of Worship activities are allowed in accordance with the Ministry of National Unity (KPN) directives. The registration of marriages for non-Muslims at the National Registration Department (NRD), Houses of Worship and Religious Associations is allowed with attendance according to NRD directives. Non-Muslim funeral arrangements are allowed in accordance with KPN directives.

24. Sports and Leisure	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> All non-contact sports and recreational activities carried out individually for the purpose of health, exercise and self-training with compliance to physical distancing of at least 2 to 3 meters and from 6.00am to 12.00 midnight subject to the current effective movement control order. Such activities include jogging, exercising, gym activities, swimming, jet skis, taichi, cycling, skateboarding, fishing, equestrian, archery, hiking, tennis/ badminton (single), golf, motoring and the like. Individual activities (with no physical contact) conducted in small groups are subject to 50% capacity usage/ area or not exceeding 50 persons including the trainer/ instructor (whichever is lower). Group activities such as aerobics, Zumba, sports dances, taekwondo with no physical contact (poomsae) and the like. The operations of all sports and commercial recreational facilities including swimming pools with compliance to 50% capacity usage/ area WITH monitored control. The attendance of workers must not exceed 80% workforce capacity encompassing management and operations. Whereas the operations of public sports and recreational facilities are SUBJECT to the Local Authorities (LA). The organizing of national or international tournaments or competitions following the SPORTS BUBBLE model is subject to PERMISSION of the Ministry of Youth and Sports (KBS) WITHOUT the attendance of spectators or supporters. Central training programs with quarantine organized by the National Sports Council (MSN) and State Sports Councils (State MSNs) using the SPORTS BUBBLE model (Camp/ Home Based Training). Central training programs including training matches with quarantine for teams in the Malaysian Football League (MFL) using the SPORTS BUBBLE model (Camp/ Home Based Training). The entry of Malaysian athletes / coaches / officials / technicians to overseas tournaments or competitions or matches is SUBJECT to approval by the Department of Immigration, Malaysia WITH the support of KBS/MSN. The entry of foreign athletes/ coaches/ officials/ technicians into Malaysia is SUBJECT to approval by the Department of Immigration, Malaysia (JIM) WITH the support of KBS/ MSN and compliance to the guidelines for the entry of foreigners into Malaysia.

Creative Industries	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Development and broadcasting of creative content through recordings or live broadcasts including animation, filming, drama, promotions, sitcoms and the like, including dance arts, theatre arts, musical arts, cultural and heritage performances as well as musical art activities are allowed without spectators and the attendance of management and crew is limited to 70%. Creative content filming activities in and outside studios (outdoors) are allowed with strict compliance to the SOP issued by the National Film Development Corporation Malaysia (FINAS). Indoor / outdoor busking activities are allowed with compliance to physical distancing. Lounge hotel performances are allowed with 50% capacity of the premise area and physical distancing. Drive-in cinema activities are allowed.
