	Actions	Brief Description
	Premise opening approval	The opening of the premises for the purpose of unloading these goods <b>must</b> have obtained approval from the PDRM by submitting proof of import/export documents of the goods.
	Workers movement	Employers need to ensure that a list of employee names is included in the operations application to PDRM.
	Number of workers allowed	<ul> <li>Maximum 8 workers for unloading of 1 cargo/container.</li> <li>Additional 2 people for each additional cargo/container unloaded at the same time</li> <li>Eg: 2 cargo/container = 8 + 2 (extra) = 10 people</li> <li>3 cargo/container = 8+2+2 = 12 people</li> <li>Only employees on duty (active duty) are allowed to be on the premise.</li> </ul>
	General health protocol	<ul> <li>Adhere to the general health protocols outlined in the SOPs of the National Recovery Plan by NSC.</li> </ul>
