Completed Vaccination | Individuals who have been fully vaccinated are individuals who have met the following criteria: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> For vaccine types that require two doses of injection (such as Cormirnaty (Pfizer-BioNTech), COVID-19 AstraZeneca (Oxford-AstraZeneca), CoronaVac (Sinovac), Spikevax (Moderna) and Covilo (Sinopharm)), the individual must have passed the 14th day from the date of injection of the second dose; or For types of vaccines that require only one injection dose (such as COVID-19 Janssen (Johnson & Johnson) and Convidecia (CanSino), the individual must have passed the 28th day from the date of injection. | | | | |



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| <p>4. General Health Protocol</p> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Licensees and premises owners are required to provide the MySejahtera QR Code facility and provide customer attendance registration book. • Hand sanitizer is provided at the entrance and its use is ensured before entering. • The use of the MySejahtera application is mandatory in the area of wide internet access. The use of customer attendance registration books is only allowed in areas where there is no internet coverage or other reasonable reasons (senior citizens, absence of smartphones etc.). • The licensee and the owner of the premises ensure that customers check in the premises using MySejahtera or manually write the names and phone numbers if there is no internet coverage. • Employers, employees, customers and visitors are required to check in MySejahtera or write manually the name and phone number that can be read (if there is no internet coverage) before entering the premises, including at Government, private and individual offices. • For shopping malls, supermarkets or department stores, customers only need to perform a body temperature scan once at the entrance of the complex and not at every business premises under one complex. • Body temperatures above 37.5 degrees Celsius are not allowed to enter the complex and premises. • The owners of complexes and premises outside the complex must ensure that only customers with "Low Risk" status including "Casual Contact Low Risk" in MySejahtera are allowed to enter tHHLr respective complexes or premises. • Licensees and premises owners ensure control of customers' entry and exit to the premises with a physical distancing of at least 1 meter. |

General Health Protocol | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Individuals 17 years of age and under are not encouraged to be in public places and facilities. • Licensees and premises owners limit the number of customers on the premises with physical distancing of at least 1 meter at any time. • Each premise must display the total number of customer entry limits at any one time. The use of a queue number system is encouraged for customers entering from a premise. • All building owners are required to provide a QR Code on each level. • Employees, suppliers and customers are required to wear face masks properly according to the recommendations of the MOH while on the premises. • Ensure good VENTILATION AND AIRING SYSTEM in the premises based on the guidelines for ventilation and indoor air quality issued by the Department of Occupational Safety and Health (DOSH). • It is compulsory to wear a face mask, especially when in crowded public places except for the following activities and places: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a) Hotel rooms or accommodation paid individually and involve members of the household. b) Solitary work space. c) Sports and recreational activities d) Private vehicle and involving household members. e) Indoor or outdoor public areas and places without any other individuals f) When eating and drinking in public places without any other individuals (other than in restaurants or food premises). |

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| <p>8.Citizens and Non-Citizens Returning/ Arriving from Abroad</p> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Citizens and non-citizen travelers who have a residence in Malaysia (including PR and Malaysia MY Second Home) who return or arrive from abroad and have been fully vaccinated, are allowed to undergo mandatory quarantine at home and are given a digital Home Surveillance and Observation Order (HSO) subject to the risk assessment of the Ministry of Health Malaysia (MOH) and details issued by the MOH. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Shows evidence of RT PCR test report with negative result conducted 3 days before departure. ➤ Have a valid certificate of COVID-19 full vaccination dose (depending on the type of vaccine). ➤ There are no symptoms during the health screening at the National International Gateway (NIG). ➤ Have a suitable residence to carry out quarantine. • Individuals who return / arrive from abroad and have not been fully vaccinated or not vaccinated must undergo quarantine at a designated quarantine centers and subject to the details issued by the Ministry of Health Malaysia (MOH). • The mandatory quarantine period for travelers from all countries is 14 days and can be extended for another 7 days if there is a need based on the results of the risk assessment conducted on the 14th day. • Travelers are required to make a daily self -assessment through the Home Assessment Tool (HAT) in the MySejahtera app and this activity should continue until the end of the quarantine period (either 14 days or 21 days from the date of arrival). • Travelers are required to undergo COVID-19 infection detection test screening viz COVID-19 RT-PCR test upon arrival at NIG. A repeat screening test of the COVID-19, RT-PCR COVID-19 infection detection test will be performed on the 10th or 18th day (for travelers who have to undergo quarantine for 21 days). |

Dine-in | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Restaurant operators including hotels, sports and recreation club houses, eateries, food stalls, catering vehicles, roadside hawkers, circulating hawkers, food courts, hawker centers, roadside food stalls and kiosks are allowed to provide dine-in services subject to the following conditions : <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Only accept clients who have been fully vaccinated and asymptomatic ➤ The owner of the business premises MUST display the notice of only accepting fully vaccinated and asymptomatic customers at the entrance of the premises. ➤ Only employees who are fully vaccinated and asymptomatic are allowed to work with the following vaccination rates: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (a) 40% : Allowed to operate with a capacity of 60% employees. (b) 60% : Allowed to operate with a capacity of 80% employees. (c) 80% : Allowed to operate with a capacity of 100% employees. ➤ The owner of the business premises must ensure that the table layout is according to the distancing and the premises have a good ventilation system. ➤ Dine-in activity with a capacity of 50% per table and physical distancing of at least 1 meters subject to Domestic Trade Ministry NRP Phase 2 SOP - Distribution Trade. • Individuals who are fully vaccinated are allowed to bring children aged 17 and under to dine-in at the premises in compliance with general health protocols. |



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| 11. Sports and Leisure | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Dine-in activities in restaurants or cafes at the club house premises are permitted. • All physical contact sports and recreational activities performed at OUTDOOR areas are RESTRICTED for individuals who are FULLY VACCINATED only to perform all sports and recreational activities from 6.00 am to 10.00 pm subject to current movement control instructions in force. • Operation of all OUTDOOR sports and recreational facilities with compliance to Sports and Recreational Sector General SOP WITH supervisory control. The presence of employees is not over 60% of the workforce including management and operations. Usage is for fully vaccinated individuals only. Individuals who are fully vaccinated are also allowed to bring children 17 years of age and under for activities with strict compliance with SOPs. • All physical contact sports and recreational activities performed individually or in groups in INDOOR areas is RESTRICTED to only FULLY VACCINATED individuals for performance of all sports and recreational activities from 6.00 am to 10.00 pm subject to the movement control command currently in force. • Operation of all INDOOR commercial sports and recreation facilities with compliance to 50% capacity of usage/area WITH supervisory control. Attendance of employees is not more than 60% of the workforce comprising management and operations. Usage is for FULLY VACCINATED individuals. Individuals who are fully vaccinated are also allowed to bring children aged 17 years and below for such activities with strict SOP compliance. • Operation of all public OUTDOOR and INDOOR sports and recreational facilities is subject to Local Governing Authorities. |

Passengers must sit in the back. • The number of persons allowed in the good carrying vehicles as well as the chain of economic or industry activities (except the transportation of workers) depend on the vehicle registration license. • The number of people allowed in the Department Vehicle or Official Position Car is based on the capacity of the vehicle. • Activities and services at all airports and ports are allowed to operate 24 hours. • Sea and land public transport services such as employee transport, stop buses, express buses, ferries and other public transport are allowed to operate based on 50% of vehicle capacity. |
