1. Area Involved	<p>PERLIS, SARAWAK, TERENGGANU and PAHANG.</p> <p>*For Sarawak, please refer to the National Rehabilitation Plan - SOP Phase 3 Sarawak.</p> <p>**For areas enforced by EMCO, the EMCO SOP in the area is effective until the expiry date of the EMCO.</p>
2. Effective Period	<p>Starting 16 August 2021 (starting 12.01am)</p> <p>*For Terengganu starting on 17th September 2021 (starting 12.01am)</p> <p>**For Pahang starting on 24th September 2021 (starting 12.01am)</p>
3. Complete Vaccination	<p>Individuals who have been fully vaccinated are individuals who have met the following criteria:</p> <p>i. For vaccine types that require two doses of injection (such as Cormirnaty (Pfizer-BioNTech), COVID-19 AstraZeneca (Oxford-AstraZeneca), CoronaVac (Sinovac), Spikevax (Moderna) and Covilo (Sinopharm)), the individual must have passed the 14th day. -14 from the date of injection of the second dose; or</p> <p>ii. For vaccine types that require only one dose of injection (such as COVID-19 Janssen (Johnson & Johnson) and Convidecia (CanSino)), the individual must have passed the 28th day from the date of injection.</p>

Activity

4. Public Health Protocol

Brief Description

- Licensees and premises owners are required to provide the MySejahtera QR Code facility and provide a customer attendance registration book.
- Hand sanitizer is provided at the entrance and its use is ensured before entering.
- The use of the MySejahtera application is mandatory in the area of wide internet access. The use of customer attendance registration books is only allowed in areas where there is no internet coverage or other reasonable reasons (senior citizens, absence of smartphones etc.).
- The licensee and the owner of the premises ensure that customers check in the premises using MySejahtera or manually write the name and no. phone if there is no internet coverage.
- Employers, employees, customers and visitors are required to check in MySejahtera or write manually the name and phone number that can be read (if there is no internet coverage) before entering the premises, including in Government offices, private and private.
- For shopping malls, supermarkets or department stores, customers only need to perform a body temperature scan once at the entrance of the complex and not at every business premises under one complex.
- Body temperatures above 37.5 degrees Celsius are not allowed to enter the complex and premises.
- The owners of complexes and premises outside the complex must ensure that only customers with "Low Risk" status including "Casual Contact Low Risk" in MySejahtera are allowed to enter their respective complexes or premises.
- Licensees and premises owners ensure control of customer entry and exit to the premises with a physical confinement of at least 1 meter.

4. Public Health Protocol	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Individuals 17 years of age and under are not encouraged to be in public places and facilities. • Licensees and premises owners limit the number of customers being on the premises with social distancing of at least 1 meter at a time. • Each premise must display the total number of customer entry limits at any one time. The use of a queue number system is encouraged for customers entering from a premise. • All building owners are required to provide a QR Code on each level. • Employees, suppliers and customers are required to wear face masks properly according to the MOH's recommendations while on the premises. • Ensure good VENTILATION AND VENTILATION SYSTEM in the premises based on the guidelines for ventilation and indoor air quality issued by the Department of Occupational Safety and Health (DOSH). • It is mandatory to wear a face mask, especially when in a crowded public place except for the following activities and places: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a) Hotel rooms or accommodation pay alone and involve members of the household. b) Solitary work space. c) Sports and recreational activities. d) Own vehicle and involve household members. e) Indoor or outdoor public areas and places without any other individuals. f) When eating and drinking in a public place without any other individual (other than in a restaurant or food premises).

Cross Country for Long Distance Husband and Wife Couples (PJJ)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Long-distance couples are allowed to cross the state for the purpose of meeting their spouses provided that both must have been fully vaccinated with PDRM confirmation and submit: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Copy of husband and wife's identity card ➤ Copy of marriage certificate/ card ➤ Copy of COVID-19 Digital Vaccination Card/ Certificate of husband and wife ➤ Copy of proof of residence of husband/ wife or employer's confirmation letter. • Show a letter of permission that has been approved by PDRM when passing through the Road Blockade
6. Cross Country for Parents/ Guardians with Children (Under 18 Years) Long Distance (AJJ)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Parents/ guardians who have children under the age of 18 and reside in different states are allowed across the state to see their children provided that both parents/ guardians must have been fully vaccinated with PDRM confirmation and submit: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Copy of mother's, father's identity card and child's birth certificate/ document ➤ Copy of COVID-19 Digital Vaccination Card/ Certificate of parents/ guardians ➤ Child's school information (if applicable) • Show a letter of permission that has been approved by PDRM when passing through the Road Blockade (SJR).



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| <p>7. Citizens and Non -Citizens Returning/ Arriving from Abroad</p> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Citizen and non -citizen travelers who have a residence in Malaysia (including PR and Malaysia MY Second Home) who return or arrive from abroad and have been fully vaccinated, are allowed to undergo mandatory quarantine at home and are given a digital Home Surveillance and Observation Order (HSO) subject to the risk assessment of the Ministry of Health Malaysia (MOH) and details issued by the MOH. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Show evidence of RT PCR test report with negative result conducted 3 ➤ the day before departure. ➤ Have a valid certificate of vaccination COVID-19 complete dose (depending on the type of vaccine). ➤ There were no symptoms during the health screening at the National International Gateway (PMA). ➤ Have a suitable residence to carry out quarantine. • Individuals who return / arrive from abroad and have not been fully vaccinated or not vaccinated must undergo quarantine at a designated quarantine center and subject to the details issued by the Ministry of Health Malaysia (MOH). • The mandatory quarantine period for travelers from all countries is 14 days and can be extended for another 7 days if there is a need based on the results of the risk assessment conducted on the 14th day. • Travelers are required to make a daily self -assessment through the Home Assessment Tool (HAT) in the MySejahtera app and this activity should continue until the end of the quarantine period (either 14 days or 21 days from the date of arrival). • Travelers are required to undergo COVID-19 infection detection test screening COVID-19 RT-PCR test upon arrival at PMA. A repeat screening test of the COVID-19, RT-PCR COVID-19 infection detection must be done on the 10th or 18th day (for travelers who had to undergo quarantine for 21 days). |

Religion	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Activities in mosques and suraus for individuals who have been fully vaccinated are allowed subject to regulations and SOPs by the State Religious Authority. • Activities at Non -Islamic Houses of Worship (RISI) for individuals who have been fully vaccinated are allowed subject to regulations and SOPs by the Ministry of National Unity.
9. Tourism Activities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Tourism activities are only allowed in the same state involving hotels and homestays. • Guests who have been fully vaccinated are allowed to undertake tourism activities in the same state by presenting the COVID-19 Digital Vaccination Certificate upon check-in. • Hotel and homestay operators need to ensure that individuals wishing to enter the premises MUST show a COVID-19 Digital Vaccination Certificate proving that the individual has been fully vaccinated. • Couples who have received a complete vaccination are allowed to bring children aged 17 years and below for tourism activities in hotels and homestays in accordance with general health protocols. • The tourism bubble on Langkawi Island is allowed to tourists who have been vaccinated by complying with the Langkawi Island Domestic Tourism Bubble SOP.

<p>10. Cruise Ship</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cruise ships are allowed with 50% of the ship's capacity provided all crew and passengers have been fully vaccinated. • Pub and nightclub activities are not allowed.
<p>11. Manufacturing, Construction, Mining and Quarrying Sectors</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • For the manufacturing, construction, mining and quarrying sectors achieve complete vaccination rates for workers as follows: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (a) 80% to 100%: Allowed to operate at 100% capacity employee. (b) Less than 80%: Allowed to operate with a capacity of up to 80% of employees only. • RTK Antigen testing on employees is performed every 2 weeks at a cost borne by the employer.

Spa, Health Centre (Wellness) and Health Massage</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Business operations of spa, wellness center and wellness massage center are allowed to visitors and operators who have been fully vaccinated starting October 1, 2021 • Employees and customers must have a complete vaccine, not a positive case COVID-19, not close contact to positive and asymptomatic cases. • Only allow customers who have an appointment. Walk-in is not allowed. • Wear gloves (disposable type), face mask, and face shield while performing activity. • Replacing (including gloves, bed sheets or mattresses or chairs) and sanitization of equipment including face shield) for each customer. • Ensure the ventilation system is maintained according to schedule. • Monitoring by MOTAC includes: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ SPA operators need to declare the number of employees who have completed the vaccine and submitted to MOTAC before being allowed to operate. ➤ Self Compliance Program SOP especially ventilation in the premises. ➤ Spot check and periodic monitoring inspections performed by MOTAC. ➤ Periodic COVID-19 detection test screening on employees who present symptoms.

13.Sports / Recreational Activities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All physical contact sports and recreational activities performed individually or in groups in OPEN (OUTDOOR) or CLOSED (INDOOR) areas are RESTRICTED to individuals who have COMPLETED VACCINATION only from 6.00 am to 12.00 midnight subject to the movement control instructions in force. . • Operation of all OPEN (OUTDOOR) commercial sports and recreation facilities in compliance with the General SOPs of the Sports and Recreation Sector WITH supervisory control. Employee attendance is not more than 80% of the workforce covering management and operations. Consumption is among individuals who have COMPLETE VACCINATION for physical contact activities. Individuals who have received a complete vaccination are also allowed to bring children 17 years of age and under for such activities in strict compliance with SOPs. • Operation of all CLOSE (INDOOR) commercial sports and recreation facilities with compliance to 50% utilization capacity/ area WITH supervisory control. Employee attendance is not more than 80% of the workforce covering management and operations. Consumption is among individuals who have COMPLETE VACCINATION for physical contact activities. Individuals who have received a complete vaccination are also allowed to bring children 17 years of age and under for such activities in strict compliance with SOPs.

Sports Activities / Recreation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Group physical contact sports and recreational activities or training performed in a controlled manner WITH supervisory control are subject to 50% utilization capacity/ area or not more than 250 people at a time including coaches/ instructors/ parents (whichever is lower). Individuals who have received a complete vaccination are also allowed to bring children 17 years of age and under for such activities or training in strict compliance with SOPs. • Organizing tournaments/ competitions/ mass sports events (no physical contact) WITH the permission of KBS LIMITED with participation not exceeding 250 people at one time. • Organizing international level tournaments or competitions according to the model SPORTS BUBBLES are subject to KBS PERMISSION only WITHOUT the presence of spectators or supporters. • Operation of all sports and recreation facilities OPEN (OUTDOOR) and CLOSED (INDOOR) public is subject to the Local Authority(PBT)/ Relevant authorities.

Activity

14. Control Movement

Brief Description

- Cross -districts within the same state are allowed.
- Cross -state (based on district boundaries set by the State Government) is **not allowed** except for long -distance couples, long -distance children and individuals whose movement has been approved by the MOH and PDRM.
- PDRM is responsible for implementing control over local areas of infection with the help of ATM, APM & RELA. The entrance and exit of the NRP area is closed and entry is controlled by PDRM.
- Movement for individuals who have been fully vaccinated is **allowed** based on the total capacity of the vehicle. Individuals are allowed to bring children 17 years of age and under in compliance with general health protocols.
- Meanwhile, for those who have not received a complete vaccine:
 - **Only three (3)** household representatives are **allowed** out only to get food supplies, medicine, dietary supplements and basic necessities.
 - A maximum of **three (3)** people only including patients are **allowed** out to seek health care services, medical, screening tests, vaccination programs, safety or emergency.
- The number of passengers in taxis and e-hailing is limited to three (3) people only inclusive driver, passenger must sit in the back.
- The number of people **allowed** in a vehicle carrying goods as well as the chain of economic or industrial activities including the transportation of workers depends on the vehicle registration license.
- The number of people **allowed** in the Department Vehicle or the Official Car of the Post is based on the capacity of the vehicle.
- Activities and services at all airports and ports are **allowed** to operate 24 hours.

12.Control Movement	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sea and land public transport services such as stop buses, express buses, ferries and other public transport are allowed to operate based on the full capacity of the vehicle. • Unloading activities at premises, factories and ports are permitted. • Movement for cases of death and natural disasters is allowed after obtaining permission from the PDRM. • The movement of disaster or humanitarian aid by NGOs needs to obtain permission from the State Disaster Management Committee or District Disaster Management Committee in the area affected by the disaster and the aid is channeled through the Disaster Operations Control Center (PKOB) in the area. • Movement across districts and states for the purpose of COVID-19 vaccination at Vaccination Centers (PPVs) outside the district or state of residence is permitted by showing appointment details on the MySejahtera application, website or SMS. • Members of Parliament and State Assemblymen are allowed across districts and states to visit their respective constituencies. • Movement for Short Term Business Visitors under the approval of the One Stop Center Initiative (OSC) for official or business purposes is allowed after obtaining permission from PDRM. • Cross-state for long-distance married couples who have not received a complete vaccine is allowed between Phase 3 and Phase 2 states with the permission of PDRM and submit: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Copy of husband and wife's identity card ➤ Copy of marriage certificate/ card ➤ Copy of proof of residence of husband/ wife or employer's confirmation letter.



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15. Public Service	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Subject to the current direction of the Secretary of State. • The operation of Government offices is carried out in a hybrid manner through the presence of office and Work From Home (BDR) use the following approaches: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Office attendance does not exceed 80% for the whole (excluding frontliners, security, defense and enforcement services) and 20% BDR by rotation. ➤ Counter services are open subject to the current instructions of the Chief Secretary to the Government. ➤ Attendance to the office must be accompanied by official instruction documents and a pass employee.
16. Private Service	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cross -state movement of workers is subject to registration or operating approval letter or employee pass or employer confirmation letter. • All private/ non -Government offices are allowed to operate on the condition of employees have been completely vaccinated as follows: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 80% to 100%: Allowed to operate with 100% employee capacity. Less than 80%: Allowed to operate with a capacity of up to 80% of employees



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Brief Description

17. Meeting

- Face -to -face meetings of Government and private agencies are **allowed WITHOUT** involving the presence of representatives of outside agencies with 50% capacity and physical incarceration. Meetings involving external agencies are **encouraged** by video conferencing.
- **Meetings are encouraged to be conducted by video conference.**

18. Seminars, Workshops, Courses, Training and Talks

- Seminars, workshops, courses, trainings and talks are **not allowed** unless ongoing in - service training can be implemented in the training area through the Camp Based Training method.
- Seminars, workshops, courses, trainings and talks conducted internally via online is **allowed**.
- Critical interviews that need to be conducted are **allowed** in person and online.

19. Official Events

- Official functions are **allowed** with 50% capacity of the premises with social distancing.



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20. Business and services	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Restaurant operators including hotels, sports and recreation club houses, eateries, food stalls, food trucks, roadside hawkers, circulating hawkers, food courts, hawker centers, roadside food stalls or kiosks are allowed to operate from 6.00 am to 12.00 midnight. • Food sales activities are dine-in, take-away, drive-through or delivery. Dine-in services for social gatherings are not permitted. • Dine-in activities with social distancing of at least 1 meter are subject to SOP KPDNHEP NRP Phase 3-Distribution Trade. • Health services such as hospitals, clinics, medical laboratories, veterinary hospitals and veterinary clinics can operate for up to 24 hours or according to an operating license. • Petrol stations are allowed to operate from 6.00 am to 12.00 midnight except petrol stations on toll highways can operate for up to 24 hours. • All distribution trade sectors are allowed to operate from 6.00 am to 12.00 midnight or in accordance with the license conditions.

24. Education

- All private educational institutions of central category such as Tuition Centers, Language Centers, Skills Centers, Training Centers, Mind Development Centers and other registered centers under the Ministry of Education Malaysia (MOE) operates face to face with rotation of 50% of class capacity.
- Reopening of all schools under the MOE and educational institutions registered under MOE to conduct Teaching and Learning (PdP) sessions face to face is subject to the determination of the MOE based on risk assessment, advice and views Ministry of Health Malaysia and the National Security Council.
- **Primary School Opening:**
 - a) Pupils with Special Needs (MBK) in the National School of Special Education and The Special Education Integration Program (PPKI) is present without rotation
 - b) Private preschool/kindergarten students attend without rotation; and
 - c) Other students conduct Home Teaching and Learning (PdPR).
- **Secondary School Opening:**
 - a) Form 6 Student Semester 2, International Baccalaureate Diploma Year 2 and Semester 3 Pre -University Program at Sekolah Sukan Malaysia (SSM) is present without rotation;
 - b) MBK at Sekolah Menengah Kebangsaan Pendidikan Khas/Sekolah Menengah Special Vocational Education and PPKI present without rotation.
 - c) Students of the Pre -University Program at SSM and students of the Sijil Pelajaran public examination class Malaysia (SPM), Sijil Tinggi Agama Malaysia (STAM), Sijil Vokasional Malaysia (SVM) and Sijil Tinggi Persekolahan Malaysia (STPM) in boarding schools entirely at Full Boarding School (SBP), Sekolah Menengah Kebangsaan Agama (SMKA)/Government Aided Religious School (SABK) Full Boarding, Art School and Sports Schools present without rotation;

Education	<p><u>Cross State</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Pupils/Students involved are allowed across the state to go to school/institution by using a letter of confirmation from KPM, MARA or Relevant Ministries/Agencies. • Movement to and from school/educational institution for the pupils/students involved can be accompanied by a guardian. • Movement of teachers/lecturers or teaching staff to schools/educational institutions for cross -state purposes for implementing PdP are allowed with a letter of confirmation from schools/educational institutions under KPM/MARA or ministries/agencies that are related. • Pupils/Students crossing the state from Peninsular Malaysia to Sabah, Sarawak and the Federal Territory (FT) of Labuan or vice versa must comply regulations related to COVID-19 screening and quarantine implemented. <p><u>Control of Pupil/Student Movement Back to Dormitory</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Movement for admission of pupils/students to hostels is allowed with use a letter of confirmation from KPM/MARA or the ministry/agency relevant for cross -state purposes. • Pupils/Students in hostels need to perform COVID-19 Self Kit Test of three (3) times, i.e. before check -in, the sixth and fourteenth day in the dormitory. • IPG students are encouraged to perform the COVID-19 Self-Kit Test the day before return to IPG or perform smear test at health facility and inform to the IPG of the test results.

Education	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All Skills Training Institutes, schools other than under the MOE, tahfiz centers and other educational institutions are subject to the Ministry/Agency related. • All HEIs under the supervision of MOHE are opened in stages to students who have completed the vaccination and have passed the period of effectiveness after complete vaccination, however, actual admission is subject to the capacity of the HEI. • All Teaching and Learning (PdP) activities in IPT face to face/group/group is allowed for students who have complete vaccination and pass the period of effectiveness after vaccination with adhere to strict SOPs. A hybrid PdP mode will be implemented for students who will be on campus. The online PdP mode will continue for students who has not returned to campus. • International examinations and professional bodies as well as research activities require laboratory facilities in the IPT is allowed in accordance with the SOP of the IPT and the movement must be accompanied by confirmation by the relevant IPT. • Students who are in dormitories, universities or educational institutions are allowed to be in such dormitory, university or educational institution and proceed hybrid learning

25. Kindergartens, Nurseries, Kindergartens, Day Care Centers and Residential Care Centers

26. Religion

Brief Description

- Nurseries and Day Care Centers under the Social Welfare Department (JKM) are **allowed** to operate in accordance with the set SOPs.
- Kindergartens, private kindergartens, kindergartens in private, international and expatriate schools as well as mind development centers for children aged 4 to 6 years are **allowed** to operate in accordance with the prescribed SOPs.
- Residential care centers or rehabilitation centers for children, the Disabled (OKU), the elderly, women and various care centers are **allowed** to operate in accordance with SOPs set under the relevant Ministry, Department or Agency.

- Activities in mosques and suraus are **allowed** according to the ruling of the State Religious Authority.
- Islamic wedding ceremonies (akad nikah) are **allowed** according to the ruling of the party State Religious Authority.
- Management of Muslim funerals and grave pilgrimage activities are **allowed** in accordance with the ruling of the State Religious Authority.
- Non -Islamic House of Worship activities are **allowed** according to the ruling of the Ministry of National Unity (KPN).
- Marriage registration for non -Muslims at the National Registration Department (JPN), Houses of Worship and Religious Associations is **allowed** with attendance according to the decision of the JPN.
- Management of funerals and grave pilgrimages other than Muslims is **allowed** in accordance with the ruling of the IGP.

Employee attendance is not more than 80% of the workforce covering management and operations. The operation of public sports and recreational facilities is SUBJECT to the Local Authority (PBT).

Brief Description

- Development and broadcasting of creative content by recording or live broadcast.
- Broadcast by recording or live broadcast in the form of information and entertainment delivery in the presence of a fully vaccinated audience with an audience capacity of 70% of the studio space.
- Filming the creative industry inside and outside the studio.
- Busking.
- Performances in the hotel lounge are allowed with a capacity of 50% of the premises space and physical confinement.
- Cinema activities provided all employees and spectators are complete vaccinated with a capacity of 80% of the cinema screening hall space.
- Live performance activities such as theater, musicals, music and comedy (pre-registered) with a fully vaccinated audience as well as an audience capacity of 70% of the premises space.
