2. Effective Period	Commencing 20 August 2021 (commencing 12:01am)				
3. Full Vaccination	<p>Individuals who have completed their vaccination are individuals who fulfil the following criteria:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> For vaccines that require two doses (such as Cormirnaty (Pfizer-BioNTech), COVID-19 AstraZeneca (Oxford-AstraZeneca), CoronaVac (Sinovac), Spikevax (Moderna) and Covilo (Sinopharm)), the individual must have passed the 14th day from the date of the second dose; or For vaccines that only require one dose (such as COVID-19 Janssen (Johnson & Johnson) and Convidevia (CanSino)), the individual must have passed the 28th day from the vaccination date. 				

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4. General Health Protocol	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> It is mandatory for the license holder and premise owner to provide a MySejahtera QR code and a customer attendance registration book. Hand sanitizers are to be provided at entrances and to ensure its use before entry. Use of the MySejahtera app is mandatory in areas with extensive internet access. Use of the customer attendance registration book is only allowed for areas without internet access or for other reasonable reasons (senior citizens, no smartphone and others). The license holder and premise owner to ensure customers check-in to the premises using MySejahtera or to manually write down their name and telephone number if there is no internet access. It is mandatory for employers, workers, customers and visitors to check in with MySejahtera or to manually write down their name and telephone number legibly before entering the premises including at Government, private sector and individual offices. For shopping centres, supermarkets or departmental stores, customers only need to scan their body temperature once at the entrance to the complex and not at every business premise within one complex. A person with a body temperature of above 37.5 degree Celsius is not allowed to enter the complex and premises. The owner of the complex and premises outside the complex must ensure that only customers with the status “Low Risk” including “Casual Contact Low Risk” in the MySejahtera app are allowed inside their respective complex / premises. The license holder and premise owner to ensure control on the entry and exit movement of customers on the premises with at least 1 meter physical distancing. 				

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4. General Health Protocol	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Children the age of 12 and under are not encouraged to be in public areas and facilities. The license holder and premise owner to limit the number of customers on the premises with physical distancing of at least 1 meter radius at any given time. Every premise must display the maximum number of customers at any given time. The use of a queue numbering system is encouraged for customers entering a premise. All building owners must provide a QR code for each floor. Employees, suppliers and customers are required to wear face masks correctly in accordance with MOH recommendations while on the premises. To ensure there is VENTILATION AND a good VENTILATION SYSTEM on the premises based on the ventilation and indoor air quality guidelines issued by the Department of Occupational Safety and Health (DOSH). It is mandatory to wear face masks especially while in congested public areas except for the following activities and areas: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Hotel rooms or privately paid accommodation involving members of the same household. Individual workspaces. Sports and recreational activities. Own vehicles involving members of the same household. Indoor or outdoor areas and public places without any other individual. While eating and drinking in public without any other individual (other than in restaurants or eateries).

Inter-District and Inter-State Movement for Long Distance Married Couples (PJJ)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Long-distance married couples are allowed to cross districts and states for the purpose of meeting their respective partners with the condition that both must have been fully vaccinated with PDRM confirmation and produce: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➢ A copy of the husband and wife’s identity card ➢ A copy of the marriage certificate/ card ➢ A copy of the husband and wife’s COVID-19 Vaccination Card/ Digital Certificate ➢ A copy of documentary evidence of the husband/ wife’s residence or employer confirmation letter. • Showing a permission letter approved by PDRM when passing roadblocks (SJR). 				
6. Inter-District and Inter-State Movement for Parents/ Guardians with Long Distance Children (Below 18 Years)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Parents/ guardians who have children under the age of 18 residing in a different district or state are allowed to cross districts and states to meet their respective children with the condition that both parents / guardians must be fully vaccinated with PDRM confirmation and produce: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➢ A copy of the parents’ identity card and child’s birth certificate/ document ➢ A copy of the parents’ / guardians’ COVID-19 Vaccination Card/ Digital Certificate ➢ The child’s schooling information (if relevant) • Showing a permission letter approved by PDRM when passing roadblocks (SJR). 				

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7. Citizens and Foreigners Returning/ Arriving from Overseas	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Citizens and foreign travellers with a residence in Malaysia (including PR and Malaysia MY Second Home) returning or arriving from abroad who are fully vaccinated are allowed to undergo mandatory quarantine at home and will be given a digital Home Surveillance and Observation Order (HSO) subject to a risk assessment by the Ministry of Health (MOH) and further details issued by MOH. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➢ Showing evidence of an RT PCR test report with a negative result conducted 3 days before departure. ➢ Having a valid and complete COVID-19 vaccination certificate (dependent on the type of vaccine). ➢ No symptoms during the health screening conducted at the International Arrival Gate (PMA). ➢ Having a suitable residence to carry out quarantine. • Individuals returning / arriving from abroad who have not been fully vaccinated or vaccinated at all must undergo quarantine at a designated quarantine center subject to further details issued by the Ministry of Health (MOH). • The mandatory quarantine period for travellers from all countries is 14 days and can be extended for another 7 days if required based on the risk assessment result conducted on the 14th day. • Travelers are required to conduct daily self-assessments through the Home Assessment Tool (HAT) in the MySejahtera application and this activity must be continued to the end of the quarantine period (whether 14 or 21 days from the arrival date). • Travelers are required to take a COVID-19 screening test that is the COVID-19 RT-PCR test upon arrival at a PMA. A repeat COVID-19 RT-PCR screening test will be conducted on the 10th or 18th day (for travelers required to undergo quarantine for 21 days).

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8. Morning Markets, Farmers' Markets, Night Markets and Weekly Markets	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Customers accorded this freedom must be fully vaccinated. Morning markets, farmers' markets, night markets and weekly markets are allowed to operate by ensuring customers who wish to enter the morning market, farmers' market, night market and weekly market area MUST show a COVID-19 Vaccination Card/ Digital Certificate which proves the customer has been fully vaccinated.
14. Picnics and Camping	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Picnic and camping activities are allowed within the same district. Fully vaccinated individuals are allowed to bring children aged 17 years and under for such activities with strict compliance to SOP.

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15. Movement Control	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Unloading activities involving non-essential goods at factories are limited to deliveries and acceptance of goods or cargo for existing stockpile for the purpose of import and export only from 8:00am to 8:00pm on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays with the permission of PDRM. Unloading activities involving essential goods are not subject to this restriction and operates as usual. Public land and sea transportation services such as worker transport, bus stops, express buses, LRT, MRT, ERL, monorail, ferries, and other public transport are allowed to operate based on 50% of the vehicle capacity (operational hours and frequency is subject to the Ministry of Transport). Movement in cases of death, natural disaster is allowed after obtaining permission from the RMP. Movement for disaster or humanitarian relief by NGOs must obtain permission from the State Disaster Management Committee or District Disaster Management Committee in the affected area and the assistance must be channelled through the Disaster Operations Control Center in that area. Inter-district and inter-state movement for the purpose of COVID-19 vaccination in Vaccination Centres (<i>Pusat Pemberian Vaksin [PPV]</i>) in a district or state outside their residential area is allowed by showing appointment details through the MySejahtera app, online or SMS. State Assemblymen and Members of Parliament are allowed to cross districts and states to visit their respective constituency without organizing any event. Movement for Short Term Business Travellers under the One Stop Centre (OSC) Initiative for official or business purposes is allowed after obtaining permission from the RMP.
