	1. Areas Involved	<p><b>WILAYAH PERSEKUTUAN LABUAN AND NEGERI SEMBILAN.</b></p> <p><b>* This SOP has to be read together with the SOP Specified for Wilayah Persekutuan Labuan</b></p> <p><b>** For areas enforced by EMCO, the EMCO SOP in those areas are in effect until their respective dates the EMCO ends</b></p>			
	2. Effective Period	<p><b>*For F.T. Labuan it commences on 26 August 2021 (from 12:01am)</b></p> <p><b>*For Negeri Sembilan it commences on 24 September 2021 (from 12:01am).</b></p>			
	3. Fully Vaccinated	<p>Individuals who have been fully vaccinated are individuals who have met the following criteria:</p> <p>i. For vaccine types that require two doses (such as Cormirnaty (Pfizer BioNTech), COVID 19 AstraZeneca (Oxford AstraZeneca), CoronaVac (Sinovac), Spikevax (Moderna) and Covilo (Sinopharm)), the individual in question must have passed the 14th day from the date second dose injection; or</p> <p>ii. For vaccine types that require only one dose (such as COVID 19 Janssen (Johnson Johnson) and Convidecia (CanSino)), the individual in question must have passed the 28th day from the date of injection.</p>			



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4. Citizens and Foreigners Returning/ Arriving from Overseas	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Citizens and foreign travellers with a residence in Malaysia (including PR and Malaysia MY Second Home) returning or arriving from abroad who are fully vaccinated are <b>allowed</b> to undergo mandatory quarantine at home and will be given a digital Home Surveillance and Observation Order (HSO) subject to risk assessment by the Ministry of Health (MOH) and further details issued by MOH.               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ Showing evidence of a negative RT-PCR test report that is valid and conducted 3 days before departure.</li> <li>➤ Having a valid and complete COVID-19 vaccination certificate (dependent on the type of vaccine).</li> <li>➤ No symptoms during the health screening conducted at Malaysia’s International Arrival Gate.</li> <li>➤ Having a suitable residence to carry out quarantine.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Individuals returning / arriving from abroad who have not been fully vaccinated or vaccinated at all must undergo quarantine at a designated quarantine center subject to further details issued by the Ministry of Health (MOH).</li> <li>The mandatory quarantine period for travellers from all countries is 14 days and can be extended for another 7 days if required based on the risk assessment result conducted on the 14<sup>th</sup> day</li> <li>Travellers are required to conduct a daily self-assessment through the Home Assessment Tool (in the MySejahtera application and this assessment must be continued until the end the quarantine period which is either 14 days or 21 days from the date of arrival.</li> <li>Travellers are required to undergo a RT PCR COVID 19 detection test upon arrival at PMA. Repeat of the RT PCR COVID 19 detection test must be conducted on day 10, or day 18 for travellers who have to undergo quarantine for 21 days</li> </ul>				



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5. General Health Protocol	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>It is <b>mandatory</b> for the license holder and premise owner to provide a MySejahtera QR code and a customer attendance registration book.</li> <li>Hand sanitizers are to be provided at entrances and to ensure its use before entry.</li> <li>Use of the MySejahtera app is <b>mandatory</b> in areas with extensive internet access. Use of the customer attendance registration book is only allowed for areas without internet access or for other reasonable reasons (senior citizens, no smartphone and others).</li> <li>The license holder and premise owner to ensure customers check-in to the premises using MySejahtera or to manually write down their name and telephone number if there is no internet access.</li> <li>It is <b>mandatory</b> for employers, workers, customers and visitors to check in with MySejahtera or to manually write down their name and telephone number legibly before entering the premises including at Government, private sector and individual offices.</li> <li>For shopping centres, supermarkets or departmental stores, customers only need to scan their body temperature once at the entrance to the complex and not at every business premise within one complex.</li> <li>A person with a body temperature of above 37.5 degree Celsius is <b>not allowed</b> to enter the complex and premises.</li> <li>The owner of the complex and premises outside the complex must ensure that only customers with the status “Low Risk” including “Casual Contact Low Risk” in the MySejahtera app <b>or a COVID-19 Vaccination Card</b> are allowed inside their respective complex / premises.</li> <li>The license holder and premise owner to ensure control on the entry and exit movement of customers on the premises with at least 1 meter physical distancing.</li> </ul>				



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5. General Health Protocol	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><b>Individuals aged 18 and below</b> are <b>not encouraged</b> to be in public areas and facilities.</li> <li>The license holder and premise owner to limit the number of customers on the premises with physical distancing of at least 1 meter radius at any given time.</li> <li>Every premise must display the maximum number of customers at any given time. The use of a queue numbering system is encouraged for customers entering a premise.</li> <li>All building owners must provide a QR code for each floor.</li> <li>Employees, suppliers and customers are <b>required</b> to wear face masks correctly in accordance with MOH recommendations while on the premises.</li> <li>To ensure there is <b>VENTILATION AND</b> a good <b>VENTILATION SYSTEM</b> on the premises based on the ventilation and indoor air quality guidelines issued by the Department of Occupational Safety and Health (DOSH).</li> <li>It is <b>mandatory</b> to wear face masks especially while in congested public areas <b>except</b> for the following activities and areas:               <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Hotel rooms or privately paid accommodation involving members of the same household.</li> <li>Individual workspaces.</li> <li>Outdoor sports and recreational activities.</li> <li>Own vehicles involving members of the same household.</li> <li>Indoor or outdoor areas and public places without any other individual.</li> <li>While eating and drinking in public without any other individual (other than in restaurants or eateries).</li> </ol> </li> </ul>

6. Movement Control	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Inter-state travel is allowed within Phase 4 States only</li> <li>Inter-state travel to Phase 1, 2 or 3 states is allowed with permission letter by PDRM using relevant documents.</li> <li>Inter-state travel to Phase 1, 2 or 3 states by employees are subject to <b>the employment pass or employer's authorization letter.</b></li> <li>Inter-state movement for the purpose of COVID-19 vaccination in Vaccination Centres (Pusat Pemberian Vaksin [PPV]) in a district or state outside their residential area is allowed by showing appointment details through the MySejahtera app, online or SMS.</li> <li>State Assemblymen and Members of Parliament are allowed to cross districts and states to visit their respective constituency.</li> <li>Movement of individuals, goods and public transport of all vehicle types are allowed based on the total vehicle capacity and vehicles' registration.</li> <li>Activities and services at all airports and ports are <b>allowed</b> to operate 24 hours.</li> </ul>



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7. Civil Service and Private Sector	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><b>Workforce capacity on-site is 100%</b></li> <li>For the civil service, it is subject to the current orders of the Chief Secretary to the Government (KSN).</li> </ul>				
8. Meetings and Interviews	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Face-to-face meetings and interviews are <b>allowed</b> with physical distancing.</li> </ul>				
9. Seminars, Workshops, Courses, Training and Lectures	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Seminars, workshops, courses, trainings and talks are <b>allowed</b> subject to <b>the capacity of the premise</b> with physical distancing.</li> </ul>				
10. <b>Official Government and Private Sector Events</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><b>Official Government and private sector events are allowed</b> subject to the premise capacity with physical distancing.</li> </ul>				
11. Social Activities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Social events such as festival celebrations, engagement and wedding ceremonies, anniversaries, birthdays, religious prayers, reunion, retreats and other social events are allowed with 50% capacity of the premise and with physical distancing.</li> </ul>

<b>13. Manufacturing</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>All activities including the supply chain are allowed to operate in accordance with their license conditions except as stated in the Negative List.</li> <li>RTK Antigen tests to be conducted on employees every 2 weeks with the cost borne by the employer.</li> </ul>
<b>14. Markets</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>All types of markets are allowed to operate according to their licenses or permits subject to local authority (with compliance to SOP and with supervision of RELA or PBT officers)</li> </ul>

III) will follow <i>Pengajaran dan Pembelajaran</i> (PdP) at college whereas Four-System Semester (Sem. I) will follow PdP at college/ PdPR.</li> <li>All <i>Institute Pendidikan Guru</i> (IPG) students return to campus in stages commencing 7 November 2021 for IPGs in Group A states and 8 November 2021 for Group B states.</li> <li>All face-to-face/group/batch PdP activities are <b>allowed</b> with compliance to prescribed SOP.</li> </ul> <p><u>Crossing States</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Students/Pupils who are involved are allowed to cross states to go to schools/educational institutions by using a confirmation letter from MOE/MARA or relevant ministry/agency.</li> <li>The movement to and from the school/educational institution for students/pupils who are involved can be accompanied by a guardian.</li> <li>The movement of teachers or lecturers to schools/educational institutions to cross states for the purpose of PdP is allowed with a confirmation letter from MOE / MARA or relevant ministry/agency.</li> <li>Students/Pupils crossing states from Peninsular Malaysia to Sabah, Sarawak and F.T. Labuan or vice versa must comply with the current COVID-19 screening and quarantine rules.</li> </ul>

Education	<p><u>Movement Control for Students/Pupils Returning to Dormitories</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Movement for the admission of students/pupils to dormitories is allowed with a confirmation letter from MOE / MARA or relevant ministry/agency for the purpose of crossing states.</li> <li>Students/Pupils in dormitories must undergo a COVID-19 Self-Test Kit three (3) times, once before registration, on the 6th day and on the 14th day in the dormitory.</li> <li>IPG students are encouraged to perform the COVID 19 Self -Kit Test the day before returning to IPG or perform swab test at a health facility and inform the IPG of the test results.</li> </ul>

PdP hybrid modes will be implemented for students on campus. Online PdP modes will be continued for students who have not yet returned to campus.</li> <li>International examinations and professional bodies as well as research activities which require laboratory facilities at HEIs are allowed in accordance with the relevant HEI SOP and movement must be accompanied by a confirmation letter from the relevant HEI.</li> <li>Students in boarding schools, universities or educational institutes are allowed to be in the boarding school, university or institution and continue hybrid learning.</li> </ul>

Spectators/ supporters must wear a face mask and there are to be no eating or drinking activities while at the sports and recreation venue.</li> <li>Allowances for the sports and recreation sector including for individuals who have not yet completed or received full vaccination:               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>All sports and recreation activities are allowed including contact and non-contact sports.</li> <li>Sports and recreation activities conducted in groups are <b>NOT TO EXCEED</b> 1,000 people at any one time subject to the area space.</li> <li>The operations of <b>all sports and recreation facilities</b> at 100% capacity encompassing usage by customers/ users and worker attendance. Operational hours are <b>SUBJECT</b> to license conditions. Whereas the operations of public sports and recreation facilities are <b>SUBJECT</b> to the Local Authority (LA) and relevant Authority.</li> <li>The organizing of <b>ALL local and international</b> sports and recreation tournaments/ competitions <b>WITH</b> permission of the Ministry of Youth and Sports (KBS).</li> <li>The organizing of mass sports tournaments/ competitions/ events <b>WITH</b> KBS permission <b>LIMITED</b> to participation not exceeding 1,000 people at any one time.
